- 7 "Sir," the invalid replied, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me."
- 8 Then Jesus said to him, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk."
- 9 At once the man was cured; he picked up his mat and walked.



# The First Presbyterian Church Scholarship Committee

is pleased to announce the availability of a limited number of scholarships for our church community on March 11th. To be eligible for consideration to receive a scholarship, a student must be an active member of First Presbyterian Church of Bismarck or must have been an active participant in the life of the church for at least three years.
