Wyatt, Calvin, Lilly, and Juni gave reports on rocks they have researched. And Pauline gave everyone samples of a mystery rock. Juniors will try to identify this mystery rock during future activities!

Iceland Spar by Wyatt

Iceland spar has many uses. One is Vikings used Iceland spar to locate the sun on a cloudy day. And it can be different colors. It is a magical crystal.

Amethyst by Juni

Amethyst is the purple variety of quartz. Amethyst has a hardness of 7. Amethyst is found in igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary rock. Amethyst is a popular stone used in jewelry. Amethyst has a colorless streak and a vitreous luster.

Heulandite by Lilly

Named in 1822 by Henry James Brooke, in honor of Johann Heinrich "John Henry" Heuland. Heulandite is usually colorless or white, but also has been found in orange, brown, yellow, brick-red, or green due to inclusions of celadonite. It varies from clear to translucent. It can be found in Iceland, on the Faeroe Islands, Scotland, Switzerland, the United States, Canada, Brazil, India, and Australia among many others.

Heulandite has hardness of 3.5-4. The crystals, which are usually tabular, are often in a distinctive form reminiscent of old coffins. Crystals usually form in curved aggregates of such crystals. Crystals may also be barrel-shaped, in groups of thick radiating crystals, saddle or fan-shaped, chisel-tipped, in foliated groups, in rosettes, and grainy. Also in elongated interconnected groups of crystals and in geode-like formations. Heulandite as a zeolite is also used in water purifiers and chemical filters.

I chose this mineral because I thought it was shiny. It looked like a pretty shark tooth.

Aragonite (arr-gun-nite) by Calvin

Aragonite is a carbonate mineral, one of the three most common naturally crystal forms of calcium carbonate, CaCO3 (the other forms being the minerals calcite and vaterite.) It is formed by biological and physical processes, including precipitation from marine and freshwater environments. Aragonite may be columnar or fibrous, occasionally in branching helicitic forms called flos-ferri ("flowers of iron.")

Aragonite can be found all over the world...as hot spring deposits when water, releasing calcium upon reaching the air, forms mounds and thick crusts around the spring (travertine.) Gem-quality crystals of aragonite can be found in Germany and Austri. Other sources include Czechoslovakia, Sicily, Greece, Spain, and Japan.

Aragonite comes in lots of shapes and colors such as red, yellow, orange, green, blue purple, grey, and browns. It is also UV reactive and glows in the dark in many different colors!

With a hardness of 3.5 - 4. It is also essential for much sea life because it not only helps keep the water at natural pH levels but it also has been successfully tested for removal of cobalt, lead, and zinc from contaminated wastewater.

While aragonite is beautiful it is not typically used in jewelry due to its fragile nature, it can scratch easily and should be handled and stored with care. If cleaning is necessary it is best to use a soft brush and mild soap with warm water.

I chose this because of the crystally shine.
