However, the main entrance is on Old Spanish Trail between Cambridge and Almeda. See the map for location of parking lots.

To get to the Dermatology Clinic new location, Enter the Main entrance (*VI on the map*) and proceed directly ahead to the "RED" elevators. Take those elevators to floor two. When you exit the elevator, you are in the elevator vestibule. Turn right. You will pass Audiology and Speech Pathology (on your right) and then Benefits (on your left). You will then come to a large set of double doors on your left marked Dermatology and Urology. Enter through those double doors and go to the end of the hall. The main Hall will have a sign directing you to Dermatology, as well as there will be Ambassadors that can help direct patients and visitors. ## **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Dermatology Grand Rounds are held Thursday morning from 8:00 to 9:00am at the Michael E. DeBankey Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Houston. This is a diagnostic/therapeutic conference organized by the Baylor College of Medicine, Department of Dermatology. Several patients will be presented at each meeting. Each patient will be placed in a separate private room, and approximately 50 physicians including medical school faculty, doctors in private practice, residents in training, and medical students will examine each patient. They are not allowed to ask questions, and the patients are asked that no information be volunteered. The only information the patient should give is to indicate the areas to be examined.

When you enter the Dermatology Clinic, please notify the nurse, clerk or the secretary that you are to attend Grand Rounds, and she will take your name and put you in a room. A resident physician will interview you briefly to get the name of your physician and any information necessary. After this, the entire group will be allowed to come in, a few at a time.

**Remember:** the point of this conference is to have affected areas of skin examined. Wear loose fitting clothes which allow easy access to the area(s) to be looked at. For total body rashes, bathing suits would be appropriate. Gowns are provided for cover-up.

At approximately 9:00 a.m., the patients are free to leave, and the physicians will retire to a conference room where each case will be discussed. Your doctor will inform you whether you should call him or her that afternoon, or whether he will call you.
