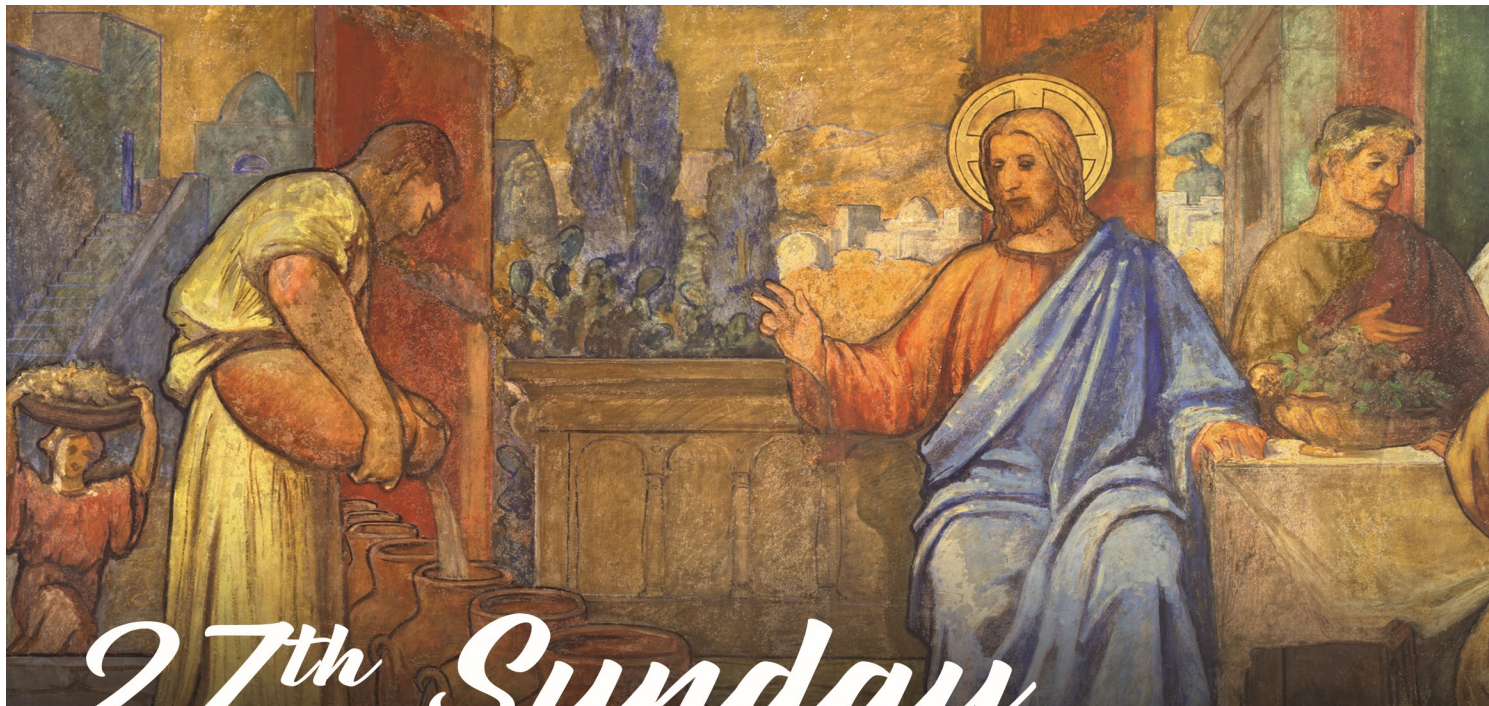

WORSHIP AND PRAYER

Everyday Stewardship: How Much Is Enough?

Good stewardship isn't always a matter of right and wrong but a matter of better and best. When confronted with a decision, we can sometimes be given a choice of good, better, and best. We fool ourselves into believing that the good choice is not a bad one, so it must be enough. However, we have essentially placed a limit on our generosity or commitment with our false sense of good stewardship.

Jesus calls us in different ways every day. Sometimes the cost to us is clear. When called to love, how much love is enough? When someone needs our time, how many hours is enough? When a small gift will bring about a positive outcome, what could a larger gift accomplish?

Don't be fooled by Jesus' teaching of the mustard seed. He was speaking to those who were caught up in concerns of status, uncertainty of heart, and lack of true faith. Jesus taught with parables and then demonstrated true faith and generosity by his crucifixion. Perhaps the mustard seed of faith allows us to move mountains and trees so that we may see through to the horizon of the cross. In the cross, we find love and generosity that is for all who follow Him.

The parts of Mass that we sing fall into two main categories: the Ordinary and the Propers. The Church calls these ‘the Ordinary’ and ‘the Propers’. This week we will learn about the Ordinary. The Ordinary consists of the parts of the Mass with unchanging words: the Kyrie (Lord have mercy), Gloria, Creed, Holy Holy, Memorial Acclamation, and Lamb of God. Each part of the Ordinary is our direct response as the people of God to some action or prayer in the liturgy. For instance, in the beginning of the Mass we’re asked to call to mind our sins, and after doing that by praying the Confiteor (I confess to almighty God...) we are so moved we break out into singing “Lord have mercy!” After being assured of God’s mercy, our grateful response is to extol his greatness in singing the Gloria. Later, during the beginning of the Eucharistic prayer, after we’re asked to lift our hearts to God, we recall that we are worshipping with the all of the saints of history, all the angels ever created, and in response to that awesome reality we sing the angels’ own prayer with them: Holy, Holy, Holy.
