GRANTING – 2018

- ✦ **MINDS IN MOTION** (\$15,000.00) - For persons in early to mid-stages of dementia and their care partners. Has an exercise component, a social component, mentally stimulating games, social interaction and separate sessions for each group
- ✦ **COPING WITH GRIEF** (\$ 4,855.00) - A Group program to focus specifically on helping children (6-9 years of age) deal with grief and loss. Includes parent sessions at beginning and end.
- ✦ **MILK COUPON PROGRAM** (\$ 10,000.00) - More than 300 women use the program annually. Each pregnant woman receives 4 litres of milk per week for up to 2-3 months post-natal.
- ✦ **OTA TA YA YIN** (\$ 5,150.00) - First Nations/Metis Elder have difficulty accessing needed services that are available in the community. It is believed that a dedicated, in-house counsellor might provide part of a solution to the problems, encouraging them to reach out.
- ✦ **SENIORS ART OUTREACH** (\$ 3,000.00) - Supports outreach programming in Prince Albert and region public long-term care homes, in Prince Albert (3) and Shellbrook (1). An inter-generational program with elementary and high school students involved.
- ✦ **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INTERVENTION/ SEXUAL ASSAULT PROGRAM** (\$ 13,295.00 Moffat, \$ 11,000.00 United Way) - 24/7 crisis intervention, sexual assault counseling. Need to expand services in Education and prevention, Counseling, Training
- ✦ **PRINCE ALBERT COMMUNITY NETWORKING COALITION** (\$ 9,000.00) - To move towards the elimination of needless duplication, increase efficiencies, promote collaboration and increase morale through support and services provided by the Coalition
- ✦ **INTEREC SUMMER CAMP 2018** (\$ 10,000.00) - To help communities welcome people with intellectual disabilities. Support Workers help to create a community where all people with intellectual disabilities are full citizens, valued and welcomed.
- ✦ **TEEN/INFANT ACCESSIBILITY PROGRAM** (\$ 2,000.00) - To provide transportation for students & their babies to & from school in cold weather and encourage their continued attendance

2 NEW DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

MNP LLP PRINCE ALBERT PARTNERS SOCIAL CAPITAL ACCOUNT - Recently established Community Fund, created by Meyers, Norris, Penny partners. All fund recipients must be qualified Donees, including Registered Charities, as required by Revenue Canada.

GAIL HARTSOOK FUND – Recently established by her family in memory of Gail Hartsook. The purpose is to support charitable activities and organizations that are within the objectives of the Foundation and more specifically, (1) School of Social Work – First Nations (2) SUNTEP – Scholarships (3) Prince Albert Safe Shelter, and (4) Children’s Haven.

4. DESIGNATED FUND

YOU specify one or more charities as perpetual beneficiaries of the annual income from your gift.

5. AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUND

A Charitable organization creates an Endowment Fund to which anyone may contribute, such as Board members or other supporters. PAACF provides expert investment management and the annual income from the Fund is paid to the Charity.

6. SCHOLARSHIP FUND
