## TODAY'S MEETING

The November 8<sup>th</sup>, KCPR meeting signaled the beginning of the preparation regarding the development of the information to be released to the Kansas Legislature in our annual report. We have many concerns about what may happen to the KPERS underfunding pattern if the legislature looks for additional funding for education following the recent Kansas Supreme Court judgment. The seriousness of further underfunding cannot be overstated!!

Without a resolution to the underfunding pattern, granting a COLA is probably unlikely. We have promised detailed rationale which supports our repeated call for a COLA. As the above mentioned information is developed and will be available to all, this rationale will become very apparent.

This year in the Legislature is a so called 'Carry Over Year', therefore, there are two identical COLA bills still in the 'hopper' in both the House and Senate. They are HB2323 & SB227.

Released at the meeting was a list of 'talking points' which have been compiled from the information we have gathered over the years. These were developed using format ideas commonly used by NRTA. We hope you will find them useful!! [Find them attached!]

Our concern about underfunding is amplified by the 'Good News' listed below. It is essential that our work as a coalition and the work of KKP be followed up by your communication with your Kansas Senators and Representatives!!!

Some GOOD NEWS

- 1. The Silver Haired Legislature recently passed two resolutions, one supporting a COLA for KPERS recipients (Resolution 3504) and a resolution asking the legislature to stop underfunding KPERS(Resolution 3503).
- 2. One of our sister coalitions KKP (Keeping the Kansas Promise) is affiliated with NPPC (National Public Pension Coalition) which will FUND a KPERS SOCIAL MEDIA CAMPAIGN promoting no further underfunding. This has begun!
- 3. Additionally, the Chair of KKP, Michael Scribner, has recently released an Op Ed entitled, Stop Messing with Public Employee Pensions in Kansas! This coincides with the Campaign announced above.
- 4. KKP will also be funding a reception following the February 5<sup>th</sup> RALLY in support of KPERS\_for those who have to work during the time of the rally.

At this day and time, the KCPR Rally in support of KPERS is scheduled on Monday, February 5, 2018. The back-up (weather date) will be Wednesday, February 7. [This date is yet to be officially confirmed, but we are fairly confident that this date will be officially confirmed.]
