Join 100 Plus Iowa County

Meet new people. See old friends. Raise some cash for great causes. That's the goal of new group being formed in lowa County to support lowa County charitable giving by organizing three social events each year in the county.

The 100+ lowa County Chapter will host an initial kick-off event Thursday, Oct. 24 at Fireside Winery, 5:30 – 7 p.m. as they seek members. "The goal is to raise more than \$10,000 in less than 100 minutes," said Lisa McGrath who is helping promote the group. "This is the power of numbers."

This is how it works, according to the group's Facebook page: "To join you make a pledge to give \$100 three times per year for a total of \$300. Each meeting includes a social hour and nominations of local charities, non-profits, or worthy causes that positively impact Iowa Co. Three eligible causes are randomly selected. Members who nominated the selected causes will make a brief, informal presentation about the organization. Each member then votes by ballot for one of the three charities. The charity with the most number of votes will be the recipient of that meeting's donations. Each member writes a check for \$100 directly to the recipient charity for a total group donation of \$10,000 or more. Through this initiative we can raise more than \$10,000 in less than 100 minutes"

Grayson Jones, Williamsburg, initiated the idea here locally, after attending a similar event in Johnson County, McGrath explained. Social giving is a growing trend popular across the country so a group decided to give it a try here.
