### **Shabbat Candles**

The lighting of Shabbat candles is a mitzvah that was implemented to bring light and a peaceful atmosphere to a holy day of rest. With its own way, every mitzvah brings light into the world. A light that is seen and appreciated by our people.

Sarah, was the first woman to light Shabbat candles which traditionally became a woman's mitzvah. Our girls began lighting these candles as soon as they could recite the blessing. This is usually by the age of four years old. When in a man's world without a woman, a man should light the candles.

The Shabbath candles are lit at least 18 minutes before sunset with two or more candles. This lighting is accompanied by blessings. Most Jewish calendars contain these lighting times for principal cities. If in doubt, find the time for sunset in the local newspaper and subtract 18 minutes. A translation for the Shabbat blessing follows: BARUCH ATAH ADONAI ELOHENU MELECH HA-OLAM, ASHER KIDSHANU B'MITZVOTAV V'TZIVANU L'HADLIK NER SHEL SHABBAT. "Blessed are you lord our G-d King of the universe, who has made us holy by giving us his commandments, and has commanded us to kindle the Shabbath lights".

The lighting in many Jewish homes takes place near the Shabbat dinner table. Some money is placed in a charity box before the lighting.

Until marriage, women and girls light one candle. Post marriage, women light two candles. In some homes an additional candle for each child is lit. For example, a wife with three children lights five candles. Young girls light before their mother. Everyone lighting their candle extends their hands and draws them in a circular motion toward themselves covering their eyes and saying the blessing.

This is an auspicious time for private prayer. While their eyes are covered, take a moment to pray for whatever you heart desires. Once a woman recites the blessing she has ushered in the Shabbath. The candles and candlesticks may not be removed until the conclusion of Shabbat, when three stars or equivalent are observed in the sky. Electric bulbs can be used as Shabbat candles when necessary, such as a hospital.


