Another church was needed to provide space for the vehicle traffic as those meals were distributed. Supply trailers were parked at one church, while the shower trailer was parked at our church. And another church provided a distribution point for basic necessities.

Paul said, "From Christ, the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work." (*Eph. 4:16*) The health of our church depends upon each part of the body doing its part in love!
