Autumn Term 2021

We have had a great start to the term. All the children have come back focused and ready to learn which is great to see.

<u>Homework</u>

The focus should be reading. Children should be reading every day. Please can you sign their reading records after they have read independently or to someone else. Also, encourage them to make notes in their reading records about the book. We will take in their reading books every Monday and talk to your child about their reading. Children will be given a reading book from school and once they have finished they will need to return these books on a Friday. In addition to this, children are allowed to bring in one book from home (appropriate for their reading level) which can be used in reading sessions within the class.

PE Days will be on a Tuesday and a Thursday for both Year 6 classes. Children will have a weekly spelling test.



We have an exciting term ahead. Here are some of the areas we will be covering...

Topic: Our learning units will be Blood Heart in which we will learn all about the heart and how to keep our bodies healthy. We will also be learning about the Victorian period in our history unit Revolution.

Maths: We will be looking at the place value of numbers up to one million, sequencing numbers and rounding to the nearest ten thousand.

English: We have been using our 'Talk for Writing' approach to learn about character description. We will also be writing nonchronological reports based on our science topic.

Science: We will be learning about the circulatory system and how to keep fit and healthy.

ICT: We will be using sequence, selection, and repetition in programs; work with variables and various forms of input and output.

<u>R.E.</u>- We will be exploring different Religions – including Islam.
