September is Coming So Early This Year

"The High Holy Days are coming so late this year." We will be hearing a lot of that the next few weeks. Actually, it is just that September has come so early. So we have plenty of time to get ourselves prepared. The fact is that this year the beginning of September corresponds with the beginning of the Hebrew month of Elul. In our tradition, Elul is devoted to preparing ourselves for the Holy Days ahead. It is called the penitential month. And more than just penitence is involved. Really it is a time for reflection and introspection. The best thing we can do is use this month to look at ourselves.

Who have we been in the past year? What have we done that we are proud of? And what have we done that we wish we hadn't? If we had that proverbial magic wand, what moments of the tapes of the last year would we erase? What promises did we make to ourselves that have gone unfulfilled? And what commitments to others?

Background: Many years ago, the congregation purchased property along Freedom Road in Lagrangeville with the intention of building a synagogue. After much money, time, and sweat equity it has been determined that for the foreseeable future we will be unable to utilize this land. 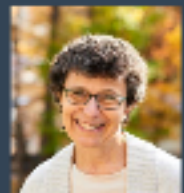
