You can also enjoy some of the investment projects that have recently been completed. Check out the new moorage facilities at the Waskesiu Lake Marina or go for a scenic cruise on the newly paved Highway #263.

While celebrating in the park this weekend, please remember, the Kingsmere Road and boat launch are still under construction and remain closed. Contractors have made significant progress over the past few weeks and the project is nearing completion. However, repeated rain events and wet conditions continue to impede the project. A completion date for the road and boat launch work is subject to weather conditions and still to be determined.

While the Kingsmere Road and boat launch area rehabilitation project is underway, visitors are encouraged to enjoy similar back-country experiences in alternative destinations.

Visitors wishing to access Kingsmere Lake during the road and boat launch closure may do so via Waskesiu Lake and the Kingsmere River. Canoes, kayaks and boats can be launched at the Narrows Marina on Waskesiu Lake and travel up the Kingsmere River to access the rail portage. Hikers who wish to access the Kingsmere Lake area may contact the Waskesiu Marina for information on a water taxi / shuttle service.
