

Essay Correction Symbols (for Spanish Grammar & Composition classes):

(I may use these on your essays. Check what type of mistakes I mark on your essays, and fix accordingly)

T = tiempo gramatical (pres. ¿ pas.? Imprf.? Pret. , cont./prog. ?...)

Mo. = modo (subj.? Ind.? Imp.?.)

Gén. = género (gender issues; M.? F.? Neu.?)

= número (pl.? sg.?)

Conc. = concordancia (agreement issues; maybe noun & its adjective, or subject-verb)

Suj. = sujeto (*conc Suj-V* =problem with Subject-Verb agreement; *conc N-A*=noun-adjective agree. issue)

Obj. = objeto (D. = directo; I = indirecto)

V = verbo

N = nombre o sustantivo (Noun)

A = adjetivo

Adv = adverbio

Prep = preposición

PRO = pronombre

BE = ser? estar?

X = elimina

→ = inserta

Art. = artículo (issues with grammar articles such as 'the' or 'a'...)

Tilde = (orthographic) accent marks

? = no comprendo

○ = some grammar problem. You should be able to figure out what it is.

V form = forma verbal (verb form, its endings, its grammar)

Wd Form = you may be using a noun instead of a verb; vice versa; or something like that

Ord. = orden de las palabras (word order issues)

Ort. = ortografía

L = léxico (word choice)

Ger. = gerundio (-ing form in English)

Inf. = Infinitivo (-Ar -Er.. endings in Spanish; and "to + V" in English)

Punt=puntuación (coma? Punto y coma? Punto? 2 puntos? Signo de interrogación/exclamación. Comilla?)

Voz = passive vs active voice issues. Most likely, if you wrote in passive, it means change to active.

Paraf. = parafrasea (paraphrase; say it another way. There is a better or more appropriate way to say it)

Nuevo Ensayo = write a whole new essay. Ignore this draft (*borrador*) and start all over. Do it differently
