Collin and I are Canadian citizens who were transferred to California in 1997

where Collin worked at Universal Studios in the Motion Picture division. We lived in Studio City and slowly started to build a circle of friends. One of those friends hosted a couple of parties a year where we met Anita & Gary Higer. At every July 4th party for 3 years, he gently encouraged us (better described as hounding!) to join square dancing. With the commitments we both had at our jobs we just felt the drive out to Calabasas was not possible on a work night. Finally, Collin retired and in September 2008 we started as Rail Dusters and graduated in June of 2009. "Doing fine in 2009" was our graduation motto and we have not looked back.

Our first year as angels, and every year since, we have served on the Board as Class Coordinators, VicePresidents, Presidents, Past Presidents, Publicity and Website Master. I was one of the organizers for the New Year's Eve Gala for 4 years. Even though I live in Canada I am still remaining on the board as Publicity and Webmaster.

We have learned square dancing up to C-1 level and have danced across the USA, usually going to National Square conventions or special square dance weekends. We have made many friends through square dancing, not only at the Trail Dusters, but from around the world. Also our family doctor is pretty amazed as how active and healthy we are - mostly due to our dancing! During the restrictions of COVID 19 we have continued to dance - twice a week we virtual dance for 2 couples at the C-1 level for 1.5 hours each session and 1 session of 1 hour at the Plus level. It is not the same BUT it is keeping the calls in our memory banks and we feel that we will be ready when dancing returns.

In August 2013 Shirley retired and in March 2014 we moved back to Canada and settled in Kingston, Ontario, a town of 125,000 located on the north shore of Lake Ontario across from New York State and almost directly north of Syracuse. Our son and 2 oldest grandsons, as well as Shirley's 5 siblings, all live here. Our other son and fiancé live in Toronto, two hours away. Our daughter, grandson, and granddaughter live in Kitchener, one hour the other side of Toronto.

But because the winters here are cold, snowy and icy we have returned to Studio City every winter for 4 to 6 weeks to visit dear friends and also Mesa Arizona for a month or two of square dancing, hiking, and swimming. We are both sorry that COVID 19 will prevent us

from doing so this winter but we will travel back as soon as we can.


