Beloved Partners in Ministry,

Our 2020 Lenten journey has begun. Over the next six weeks we will be challenged to look for Jesus in the world around us. Matthew 25 reminds us that in loving and serving our neighbors, we are loving and serving Jesus.

Throughout Lent, we will witness biblical characters come to life as talented friends share with us stories from Scripture.

March 1: "When did we see you sick or in prison?" Two brothers plagued by demons are freed from their affliction.

March 8: "When did we see you lonely?" A leper, forced to live apart from his family is healed by Jesus loving touch.

March 15: "When did we see you thirsty?" The woman at the well shares her encounter with Jesus.

March 22: "When did we see you hungry?" The boy who shares his lunch with 5000 people speaks of how Jesus provided food for those who were hungry.

March 29: "When did we see you a stranger?" A Canaanite woman's daughter shares how her mother was able to change Jesus' mind after a conversation about God's kingdom.

Each week in worship we will pray, "Help us to see you" as we listen to these stories of God working in the lives of others. We will be invited to open our eyes to the way that God continues to work in our world. To help us think about our own context, prayer banners will line the walls of the sanctuary offering us an opportunity to share our own stories and prayers. The banners will focus our thoughts on where we see God in our lives, in our church, in our world, and in our neighbors.

Having our eyes open to seeing God in the people we meet is not always easy. It will take practice, focus, and discipline. As we journey together through Lent, I invite you to use the following prayer practice to keep you focused. At the beginning of each day, ask God for help. "God, help me to see you in the people I meet, and in the world around me." As each day closes, again, ask God for help. "God, where did I see you today?" If journaling is helpful for you, jot down these thoughts so you can share them on our prayer banners.

May our eyes be opened to the face of Jesus in our neighbors and God at work in the world. Amen.

Deacons Called To Serve

Get the Scoop on Buying Prescriptions on the Internet.

What could happen if I buy from fraudulent online pharmacies? You could get a fake drug with the wrong ingredients, which could lead to a bad reaction—potentially making your condition worse—and even result in death. At best, these medicines may be less effective or have unexpected side effects. Also, most fake online pharmacies lack adequate safeguards to protect personal and financial information, and some intentionally misuse the information you provide.

How can I recognize a fake online pharmacy from a real one? It may not be obvious. Many online pharmacies use fake storefronts that closely resemble legitimate ones. They might sell drugs with a prescription or by completing an online questionnaire. They might offer discounts or cheap prices that seem too good to be true. They might be located outside the U.S. They might send unsolicited email or other spam offering cheap medicines.

How can I ensure an online pharmacy is safe? Check the pharmacy's license through your state board of pharmacy. The FDA has an online tool that allows you to search by state to locate state-licensed online pharmacies (www.fda.gov/BeSafeRx). Also make sure they require a valid prescription.

The I & S committee reported that the church ended 2019 in the black for the first time in several years. In January, we continued the positive financial trend where our receipts exceeded our expenditures by \$1639.08. This is great news for the church!

Update on Per Capita

We currently have received a total of \$1899.00 towards per capita from a total of 51 church members. Thank you to all of the members who have contributed their payment. Last year we collected \$2596.00 in per capita. Our goal is to collect at least half of the \$4576 that we pay to the greater PCUSA. That amount is \$2288 and we are just \$453 from reaching our goal. The amount per member is \$32.00. If you no longer receive envelopes, the I & S committee has created envelopes that have been placed in the pews at church designated for Per Capita. Please prayerfully consider paying Per Capita and helping to reach our goal.

Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP) takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed. Receives 36% of funds raised.



Sefl-Development of People invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues. Receives 32% of funds raised.

Children's Church School Mission Project #2


