Winkler said Monday in Hutchinson at the Dillon Lecture
Series: "How you learn, at what rate you learn has nothing to do
with how brilliant you are."

Diagnosed with dyslexia at the age of 31, Winkler joked Monday morning about his own struggles growing up with dyslexia.

"I was told that I would never achieve," Winkler said. "I was told that I would not make anything out of myself, that I was stupid, that I was lazy."

He told the crowd he was no different than anybody else, except "probably shorter," joking about his 5-foot-6-inch frame.

Winkler said his parents were Jewish immigrants who came to America after escaping Nazi Germany. His father hoped he would join the family's lumber business, but Winkler said he'd dreamed of becoming an actor since he was 7 years old. Today he tells, "You don't badger your child. You support your child, because the child will eventually meet their destiny."

Winkler signed his books with, "The World is Yours" & "You have greatness in you,"


