2017 Fire Wise Crew

The district will be hiring three (3) part-time positions to participate in the Fire Wise program in conjunction with the Kittitas County Conservation District. We will be hiring one supervisor and two additional crew members. The start date will be April 1st and running through June 30th. It is anticipated additional funding will be available through grants, which may extend crew through October 31st.

The hourly wage for the supervisor position will be \$18.00 per hour. This is a part-time position and therefore does not qualify applicants for the Fire districts medical benefits or PTO program.

The hourly wage for crew positions will be \$15.00 per hour. This is a part-time position and therefore does not qualify applicants for the Fire districts medical benefits or PTO program.

Applications will be received until 4pm on March 23rd. Interviews will begin the week of March 27th. Applicants will be notified of available interview appointment times. Applications are available at the main office, 123 East First Street or may be downloaded from our website at www.kittitascountyfirerescue.com.

Applicants must be wild fire Red Card FF2 certified or willing to attend training for certification at this entry level position as part of the job safety requirements. Additionally, applicants must pass background screening and driving history review.

Physical arduous daily work assignments will consist of cutting and trimming of brush and small trees, chipping debris and maintenance of district provided equipment. Crews will be trained in maintenance procedures, to operate various hand tools, chain saws, and how to safely operate around a brush chipper. Class B Faller is needed for one position.

Expectations: Crews will be required to wear ear, eye, hand, foot and head protection at all times. The district will provide all required safety equipment as needed. Crews will be provided work clothing.

The fire-wise crew supervisor will oversee the daily work assignments, record daily work hours and see to the needs of the crew, while providing for safety at all times. The supervisor will receive the work assignments from the Fire Wise program manager for the Kittitas County Conservation District. The crew supervisor will report directly to the Deputy Chief of Operations.
