October as Italian-American Heritage Month was first celebrated in 1989 when it was proclaimed by President George H. W. Busch and the Congress of the U.S. to honor the achievements and contributions of Italian immigrants and their descendants living in the United States.

In the early 1900s, thousands of Italian immigrants came to the United States, searching for a better life just like many other

immigrant groups. About 5.5 million Italians immigrated to the U.S. between 1820 and 2004. The greatest influx of migration took place between 1880 and 1920 when over 4 million Italians came to America. We celebrate Italian American Heritage and Culture month every year to honor the successes and valuable contributions of Italians Americans.

The largest influx of Italian immigrants arrived when coal mining companies were recruiting thousands of men to work the deep mines of West Virginia; Italian immigrants also found work on railroads and farms. Usually, the men came first, then sent for their wives and children after they had saved enough money.

By the second half of the century, Italian Americans excelled in every career field, including law, medicine, teaching, and the arts. Religion and family have continued to be an important part of their heritage. In the new millennium, more Italian Americans are rediscovering their roots, returning to Italy to seek out a relative, baptismal records, or any other family reference.

Here are Five Ways Italians changed American History.

- America's name is Italian inspired Amerigo Vespucci, who explored the east coast of South America between 1499 and 1502, is the source of the name "America."
- An Italian explorer discovered the New World. Christopher Columbus landed on various Caribbean islands that are now the Bahamas as well as the island later called Hispaniola.
- An Italian first mapped the East coast Italian explorer Giovanni da Verrazzano was the first European to map the Atlantic coast of today's United States.
- The Declaration of Independence has Italian inspiration. Filippo Mazzei, a physician and promoter of liberty, was a close friend and confident of Thomas Jefferson. He published a pamphlet containing the phrase "All men are by nature equally free and independent."
- The Pope helped Italian immigrants. To assist immigrants in the U.S., Pope Leo XIII dispatched a contingent of priests and nuns. Among them was Sister Francesca Cabrini, who founded schools, hospitals, and orphanages.

Each October, we come together and celebrate National Italian American Heritage Month. It is a time set aside for the 18 million Americans of Italian descent to reflect on their family's history, traditions and values. The most meaningful way to do this is by making certain your family's story is kept alive: Pass it on to your children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews. Explain to them where your family's roots are in Italy, the difficult journey your immigrant ancestors had, the prejudices they faced when they arrived in America and the sacrifices, they and their children made to ensure a better life for all of us today.
