4th Sunday Easter Year A Jn 10:1-10



"Jesus said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them. So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

"If it is There would be much more to say about the importance of presiding and what care it requires. On different occasions I dwelt on the demanding duty of preaching the homily. Here I limit myself to several other broad considerations, always wanting to reflect with you on how we are formed by the Liturgy. I think about the regular rhythm of Sunday Mass in our communities, and I address myself therefore to priests, but implicitly to all ordained ministers. 56. The priest lives his characteristic participation in the celebration in virtue of the gift received in the sacrament of Holy Orders, and this is expressed precisely in presiding. Like all the roles he is called to carry out, this is not primarily a duty assigned to him by the community but is rather a consequence of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit received in ordination which equips him for such a task. The priest also is formed by his presiding in the celebrating assembly (Desiderio #55-6)

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

4th Sunday Easter Year A

In 10.1-10

Did the superhero Batman's sidekick Robin ever say, "Good Shepherd, Batman"? I don't think so either but I don't claim to have seen all the original episodes! But if Robin didn't say it, he surely could have! Doesn't it sound like something he'd say? In today's gospel, John tells us that "Although Jesus used this figure of speech (about sheep hearing voice of shepherd), they (Pharisees) did not realize what he was trying to tell them" (John 10:6). Jesus points out that His sheep hear His voice (John 10:3 & 4). They follow Him because they know His voice-they know He is talking to them. They know that His heart is with them-He loves them. This is not so, regarding the thief & robber shepherds (Jn10:1) or stranger-shepherds (Jn 10:5). The sheep avoid or run from them (bad shepherds). Jesus suggests that the Pharisees & Scribes were 'bad' shepherds (looking to 'fleece' the sheep instead of serve & care for the sheep). Actually, Jesus would rather 'give his own skin' instead of fleecing His sheep, which He says in John 10:15 & 17 when He tells us that He 'lays down His life for His sheep." The sheep sense the Shepherd's care; it is in His voice. But, such concern and care is not heard in the Pharisees' voice-speech. This universal recognition of Jesus' compassion in His voice is referred to Matthew in 7:28-29, when he notes that "the crowds were astonished at Jesus' teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as their scribes."

As a Good Shepherd, Jesus seeks out the lost and wayward (those who close their ears to His voice - or exercise 'selective hearing'- Does that sound familiar?) In, Matthew 18:12-13, Jesus tells us about Himself as the Good Shepherd who is willing to leave the 99 to go find the one lost sheep. So, Jesus does not give up on anyone. He tries to break through the self-centeredness and self-righteousness of the Pharisees & Scribes to have them change their ways- turn to God. But tragically, they do not listen.

So it is no surprise that the Pharisees, do not 'hear' Jesus calling them out, for bad shepherding. They do not know Jesus' voice. They don't even seem to try listening to Him. Why? Well, who knows the reasons when the human heart sabotages itself? Maybe it is envy or jealousy over Jesus' ministry challenging their grip of control over religious institutions? Maybe it is laziness, and they do not want to exert any extra effort? Maybe they are accustomed to pleasure, and do not want to sacrifice? Or maybe simple distraction and diversion, so that they just don't want to give Jesus any time in their otherwise busy and 'important' schedules? But regardless of their avoidance of Jesus' call to them, His voice remains faithful. He always tries to reach them and speak to them.

I am struck by how important Jesus' VOICE is in several of the resurrection appearance stories. Often the voice of Jesus speaking, is what pushes people into recognizing that it is truly Him alive again. When Jesus speaks, people recognize, "It is the Lord". (Do you remember the old commercials for investment brokerage firm EF Hutton, "When EF Hutton speaks, people listen"?) Several times, Jesus' followers do not recognize Him resurrected, until after He speaks directly to them. Mary Magdalene at the tomb garden doesn't realize Jesus is in front of her until He speaks her own name to her. In John 20:16, it says, "Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni," which means Teacher." Or again on the Road to Emmaus, the two disciples do not recognize that the stranger walking with them is Jesus, until he speaks directly to them the prayer words of the Holy Eucharist Meal (which they would have heard at the Last Supper), and their 'eyes are opened to recognize Him in the Breaking of the Bread'. As they recount it later, they tell us that "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" (Luke 24:32). I would suggest that even with Thomas, more than the sight of Jesus' wounds, the one trigger for Thomas' assertion of faith, resulted from Jesus personally addressing Thomas by voice. John 20:27, shows *Jesus directly talking to Thomas*. It says, "Then Jesus said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Something in Jesus' voice-His sheep recognize Him! Again, as John 10:4 told us, "the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice." Peace, Fr Brian
