

Assemblyman Magnarelli presented Common Council President Van Robinson with Proclamation for his forty years of service to the Syracuse community.


New SUNY Chancellor makes a visit to OCC

Dr. Kristina M. Johnson joined The State University of New York as its 13th Chancellor in September, 2017. She is an engineer, entrepreneur, inventor, and more. Prior to her joining SUNY, she was the Co-founder and CEO at Cube Hydro Partners, a successful company that brought renewable energy to regions throughout the Mid-Atlantic. Before that venture started, she served as U.S. Under Secretary of Energy under President Barack Obama. In the academic world, she served as Johns Hopkins University Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dean of the Pratt School of Engineering at Duke University, and Professor at the University of Colorado-Boulder.
