

Sharing Our Family Stories

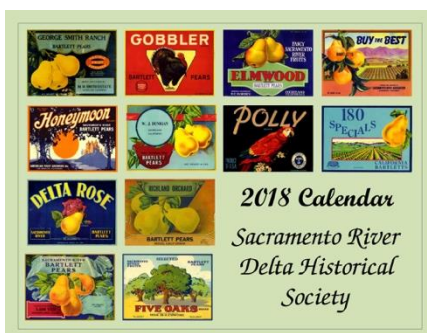
Sacramento River Delta Historical Society
