The apparition in County Mayo in Ireland of Our Lady of Knock is reported to have occurred on the evening of August 21, 1879, the vigil of the octave of the feast of the Assumption. Those who witnessed the miracle ranged in age from five years old to seventy-five.

The apparition was described as follows: “Our Lady was wearing a large, brilliant crown and clothed in white garments. On her right was Saint Joseph, his head inclined toward her and on her left Saint John the Evangelist. To the left of Saint John was an altar on which stood a cross and a lamb.” Standing only a few feet off the ground, the Blessed Virgin wore a white cloak and was described by witnesses as being incredibly beautiful. She wore a bright golden crown, and appeared to be praying with her eyes looking toward heaven with her arms bend in front of her with her palms facing inward.

From Sister Lisa...

Do you have a memory of your mother that stands out and somehow has helped to define who you are now? When I was two years old, my mother and father had a wrought iron fence put around our front patio at our row house in Mayfair to prevent me from running around. My mother often told me the story that the day after it was installed, she put me in and I climbed out. I loved hearing this story over and over because I liked the idea that nothing could hold me back. I still like that idea, but I've matured a little since then, and realize that boundaries are good and necessary. In that context, Covid19 has challenged us to respect boundaries in order to protect ourselves and others. We wear masks and stay six feet apart. Like our patio fence, the intent is to protect us and others. Though my fence climbing days are limited, if not gone (I still think I could climb a fence if needed), I still like that idea that nothing can hold me back. Silly me...

On December 29, 2019, my sister, Maureen, died suddenly and unexpectedly. That was a fence I couldn't climb or break through. With all my education in psychology and spirituality, and almost 45 years of prayer and retreat, I felt like I walked smack dab into a giant wall, the way Donna did, nose first, into the glass door in South Carolina. Ouch! Life does "ouch" us sometimes.

So I went on retreat in June, pretty mad at God. "Why did you take her?" In my head, I knew God didn't take her, but my heart and head were far, far apart. It took time and lots of tears but through God's grace, I began the process of knowing in "my deep heart's core," (Yeats) the following:

People die. Whether by sickness, accident, poor choices, or tragic events, people die. They leave us and our precious world, and go to God who welcomes them with open arms, the same arms that gave them life. I had the extraordinary blessing of a deep sense that God loves me so much that he would never hurt me. God didn't take Maureen, her body gave out and God received her. The proverbial wall or fence of grief and loss didn't tumble down or miraculously disappear, and I didn't climb it. But I sat before it, paralyzed at times, and waited and wept. There was no earthquake or fire. God came in the "low sound" like water lapping on the shore...like the whisper of God referred to by Elijah in 1 Kings 19, a whisper of love. I shouted at the whisper: "It's not fair; this shouldn't have happened; why God?" God whispered again, "trust me." I have always tried to trust God but this was a darkness I couldn't fathom. God whispered again. "Maureen is no farther than I am. Why do you think I whisper? Because I'm so close and so is Maureen." God continued, "Jesus put an end to death; He is the Resurrection. Maureen is with me, whole and happy. I would never hurt you, Lisa." By the way, this took six months for me to hear.

Well, I still cry and wonder, and miss Maureen, but deep in my heart's core, I know she is with God. And I try to return to that heart knowledge so it doesn't slip away or the Old Boy doesn't steal it. I hope this reflection helps you. We all suffer losses; we all question God. At two, I climbed the fence. Grown up fences are much more challenging, but I have tools and faith and my LAOH sisters... and so do you!

God bless you and count on my sincere prayer for you that you hear the "low sounds" of God in your "deep heart's core."
