As you may well know, there are common themes for the teachings and life of Jesus. One of the first ways we get to know Jesus of Nazareth is that he is "lowly of Spirit." It is an odd turn of phrase, but I read it to be "humble." Born in a stable, rode on a donkey kind of humble. It is a kind of spirit that always puts others first.

I am struck by the gentleness of Jesus. Sometimes I feel thrown off by the word gentleness in our modern usage. Sometimes the connotation of gentle is something akin to quiet, mellow, delicate, spineless, and yet in my view of the life of Jesus, I see his gentleness in including everyone, in endless outreach to those in need. Tenderness and compassion were his signature.

And, at the same time, Jesus spoke his mind about issues of justice and offered new life to every person and creature. He relentlessly spoke of peace and community, and while doing so he never elevated himself above others, but came alongside others and lifted them.

Jesus shared harsh words about those who claimed to be leaders of the people. Always on the side of the downtrodden, the left out, the lost, he did not mince words when it came to leaders who put themselves first at the expense of others. He was clear about his calling and true to his mission. And as Brian McLaren reminds us in his book We Make the Road by Walking, God is not setting up some kind of forgiveness market where only the elite prosper, but indeed building a whole forgiveness economy that includes everyone.



Mental Health Forum, "Find Hope" Saturday, May 4, 1—4 p.m. Winona Grange, 8340 SW Seneca St

Tualatin UMW, Winona Grange and the Tualatin Community Police Foundation are jointly sponsoring a community discussion of depression, suicide prevention, and mental health at the historic Winona Grange. An engaging story of one person's struggle with depression and social media will open the forum, followed by a panel of experts on where to find hope. Experts will include Washington County Department of Health and Community Services staff, sheriff's office, and Women's Health Care Associates. A suicide prevention specialist from the Veterans Administration will also participate. The event is free. Resource materials will be made available during a reception following the program. Help spread the word about this timely chance to learn about a growing problem today.
