ACTIVE PARTICIPATION

(Acts 6:1-7; Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19; 1Peter 2:4-9; John 14:1-12)

"It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word." (Acts 6:2)

I recently attended a priests' meeting where we spent almost three hours listening to fellow priests talked about nothing but how to consolidate structures, increase material output, save and invest more money. I sat there wondering whether I was at a priests' meeting or at a meeting of the brightest business executives in town. I came out of the meeting feeling frustrated and disappointed. When I shared my frustration with one of the priests, he quipped, "The Church cannot be run on the rosary alone." Very true, the Church needs money to carry out its work effectively. But when we put too much emphasize on the material, we are bound to "neglect the word of God to serve at table."


Today's first reading tackles significantly the issue of participation and cooperation in the mission of the Church. Every Christian faithful is exhorted to carry out his or her duties in the Church, and to participate actively in the different ministries of the Church. In today's first reading, we see that there was dissention in the early Church. The community had grown so rapidly that its ability to organize and take care of the pastoral and spiritual needs of its members was compromised. The immediate solution was to seek the involvement and cooperation of more members in carrying out the various duties that were present in the Church at that time.

In today's consumerist and materialistic world, there is a great temptation for us ministers of the words to be caught up with so much of the "serving at table" rather than "serving the word." The mission of the Church has always been to "heal the sick, bring comfort to the poor and the needy; and to set prisoners free." Many of us pastors have neglected this important mission; instead, we worry so much about new renovations to the rectory, the church, and how to build structures that we forget the care of the souls. We worry about how we are going to pay the bills and / or support the institutions. In today's gospel, Jesus says to you and me, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God, have faith also in Me." If we truly have faith in God, then you and I must believe that He is going to provide the necessary assistance to get His work done.

God will surely get His work done, but not without the active participation of all God's people. Sometimes ministerial and administrative burdens are inadvertently placed on the Church's leaderships, because, either they are too proud to invite the laity to participate in the work of the Church, or the laity have refused to play a more active role. When the leadership of the early Church noticed that they were distracted from ministering the word of God to the people, they decided to select from among themselves "men filled with the Spirit and wisdom" to carry out the task of serving the material and administrative needs of the Church, Likewise, in our Parish of St Bartholomew, we have various tasks that should be performed by you, the parishioners – we need people to serve on the Parish Council, Finance Committee and other committees. We need you to help "serve at tables" so that your priests can devote more time to "serving the word of God."
