

JUNIOR THEOLOGY (GRADE 11) SUMMER READING (in preparation for Junior Theology)

Dear Juniors:

In preparation for Junior theology next year, I would like you to read some important books of the New Testament. The Junior year of theology concentrates on the church, its history and theology (ecclesiology). Throughout the year we will be studying the books of the Bible listed below as sources of the Catholic Faith. The two important books of the New Testament are:

- 1) The Gospel of John (21 chapters)
- 2) The Letter to the Ephesians (6 chapters)

To complete this summer assignment, read a chapter of the Bible everyday to get into the habit of reading God's sacred word daily. It would be a good idea to take notes on these chapters. You should write a short summary of each chapter listed below after reading it. In the first few days of school in the Fall we will be discussing these chapters and rewriting the summaries of what you have read.

Some chapters are important enough to commit to memory so that you can discuss their contents off the top of your head. You don't have memorize the chapter but you should be able to recount its general contents.

Gospel of John: chapters 1, 3, 6, 8,10, 14-17, 19

Letter to the Ephesians: Read and know the contents of each 6 chapters. Important!
