The other day, while surfing the Internet, I came across an article titled "10 Reasons Why Seniors Don't Eat Properly". The article listed reduction in senses of sight, smell, taste, medication, difficulty in chewing which most of us at Colonial Acres know all too well.

The reasons that really caught my attention were the following: a) Dining Alone

**b)** Monotony and **c)** Unwilling to Cook. Are you a member of this group? I have a solution for you that may help your problem. It's called Senior Dinning.

In March, 2012, at the suggestion of the then Mayor of South Lyon, members of the Clubhouse Committee contacted the Meals on Wheels program in Howell to inquire of the services and the procedures to become an approved site. A representative from the agency met with us and explained the program mission and where Colonial Acres Phase V could best benefit from the program. We learned that we could be approved as a "congregate site" to provide lunches for seniors (over the age of 60) who normally eat alone and benefit from companionship comradiere at meal time. The paperwork began shortly after and in October, 2012 we served our first lunch and lunches have been available

at the Clubhouse every Tuesday and Thursday ever since.

During the many months of operation 50-60 residents have enjoyed the services and the meals. Some come on a regular basis and some sporadically. They dine and talk and the word "comradiere" is in full bloom. We accomplish our mission at every luncheon.

Sooooo.....if you are interested in joining the group for lunch this is what you need to do: check out the monthly menu that is posted on the bulletin board in the Clubhouse, call me if you have any questions, spread the word and perhaps you can find a neighbor or friend who can come with you or meet you there, call and make a reservation 24 hours in advance of the day you want to come. I call in the full order at noon on Monday-for Tuesday and noon on Wednesday -for Thursday.

# **History in Your Backyard**

Thanks to Phase V resident John Bell, we have uncovered a major piece of history in neighboring New Hudson-an 1100 acre plot of land owned by Charles Sorenson, mastermind and key developer of the moving assembly line at Ford Motor Company. His investment property was located along 11 mile on the south and Milford Rd. across Grand River to the North. It included 8-10 farm houses, barns and silos. After retiring from Ford, Sorenson joined Willy's Jeep Overland who manufactured the wartime jeep, as their president. During his tenure, he was involved in developing the AgriJeep, a combination car and tractor which was demonstrated to US Government officials during wartime at the New Hudson location. Prototype jeeps were often seen driving around the Lyon Township New Hudson area as recalled by some area old timers.

According to a Lyon Township Downtown Development District brochure on Charles Sorenson, one of his most significant accomplishments was design of the Willow Run bomber plant assembly line processes to produce an unheard of one bomber per hour, compared to the aircraft industry's one bomber per day.

The B-24 final assembly line at Willow Run in Ypsilanti was the largest manufacturing plant in the world, covering 3,500,000 square feet of floor area. Sorenson accomplished this feat by having the plane built in several subassemblies which were stockpiled and then joined as a final product. It took approximately 17000 man hours to complete the subassemblies and then marry them into the final airplane.

# Turkey tales for the table

It once was a treat to sight a group of wild turkeys up north, but these days you might even spot them at Kensington Metropark, where a group took up residence a few years ago. Although the wild turkey population has made a great comeback in Michigan, I'd bet most of our tables will host a domestic bird instead of a wild one this Thanksgiving.

So before you grasp your knife and fork, let's take a look at the differences between the wild and domestic turkey. Although they are the same species, they are very different birds...you might say birds of a different feather.

Benjamin Franklin wanted wild turkeys to be our national symbol instead of the bald eagle. He felt that the stately, majestic qualities of the wild turkey would make it a fine symbol for the new country. One of the largest birds in North America, an adult gobbler (male) can grow up to 4 feet long from his beak to his tail. In spite of its large size and rather awkward appearance, the wild turkey is a powerful flier, reaching speeds of up to 55 mph over distances up to a mile.

The white, domestic turkey lost its ability to fly through selective breeding that created heavier, broad-breasted birds, a feature much desired by chefs and commercial turkey producers. The shorter legs of the domestic turkey also mean it can't run as well as its wild cousin. Be it Butterball or any other brand, that's what you are serving for dinner.

The separation of the wild and domestic turkey began hundreds of years ago. Native Americans domesticated turkeys before Europeans set foot on the continent, and turkeys were raised in Mexico and Central America for more than 500 years before the Spanish arrived. Turkey relics have been found in Arizona dating as far back as 25 A.D., and turkey-raising may well be one of the oldest forms of organized meat production in the Northern Hemisphere.

Wild turkeys are found in many areas across

the U.S. and part of Ontario, including most counties in Michigan. They had disappeared

from Michigan by 1900, probably due to loss of habitat, and unregulated hunting. After several attempts to restore the population, Michigan successfully introduced birds from Missouri and Iowa into the wild in the 1980s. There are now more than 200,000 throughout Michigan. If you want to eat one of these, you'll have to get a license and go hunting for it.

Turkey Trivia for the Table: Most people are familiar with the term "flock of pigeons" and a "gaggle of geese," but did you know that a group of turkeys is called a "rafter"? And baby turkeys are called poults. Adult males are gobblers and females are hens. See if you can stump someone at the dinner table this year. Gobble, gobble! Happy Thanksgiving!

# **Easy Pumpkin Pie Bites**

1 cup pumpkin puree

1 package cream cheese

½ cup sugar

2 eggs + 1 egg for egg wash

1 tsp vanilla

1 tsp pumpkin pie spice

Whipped cream

Premade pie dough



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease & flour non-stick mini muffin pan. Roll dough out with rolling pin. With round cookie cutter (3 in. diameter), cut 24 rounds out. Press each round into the mini-muffin pan. Use your fingers to round the edges into a pie crust. Brush egg wash from one egg to the top edges of each pie. In mixer, beat cream cheese & sugar until smooth. Add eggs one at a time until well mixed. Add pumpkin puree. Stir in vanilla & pumpkin spice. Spoon mixture into each mini pie crust up to the top. Bake for 15-20 mins or until golden around edges. Remove and let cool. Top with whipped cream and sprinkle with cinnamon or pumpkin pie spice.


