RADAUTZER AWARD

OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD FOR AMERICAN ENDURANCE RIDERS COUNCIL (AERC)

In order to celebrate the outstanding achievements of horses with Shagya-Arabian blood, the North American Shagya-Arabian Society (NASS) has created the "Radautzer Award" for NASS-registered horses competing in AERC rides.

Named after the horses from the famous Austrian military stud farm of Radautz (located in present-day Romania) a horse with exceptional courage and stamina in Europe received the highest praise if described as "tough as a Radautzer".

USDF ALL-BREED AWARDS

NASS is a member association of the United States Dressage Federation's All-Breed Council and proudly sponsors the field of dressage. If you wish to participate, you MUST join USDF and fulfill their requirements for this program. USDF maintains all records for the All-Breeds Awards, sending a list of ALL participating Shagya-Arabian horses to our office each year from which we select our highest placing members and their registered horses to receive awards. The number of USDF All-Breeds Awards given by NASS varies from year to year depending on your participation in the program. There will be separate awards for Purebred Shagya-Arabians, Part-Shagya-Arabians, and Part-Shagyas at all levels. Up to 5 awards will be awarded.

Award Eligibility Requirements: All horses must be registered as Purebred Shagya-Arabians, Part-Shagya-Arabians, or Part-Shagyas with NASS. The horse owner must be an active member of NASS at the time points are earned. In addition, owners must register their horses with the NASS Performance Awards Program. This is a onetime, lifetime registration of their horse which covers all the above categories.

Points Recording Requirements: When your horse is registered in the NASS Performance Awards program, you will be sent **Show Recording Forms**. *Please keep the originals and make copies of these forms to send to NASS with your show results.* Updated forms will be sent to you as necessary. When you receive updated forms, please destroy all copies of the older forms that you may still have in your possession, replacing them with copies of the new form. *Use one form per show or event per horse.* If more space is needed to list class numbers and placement, use the back of the form. *Show Recording Forms must be filed within 60 days of the date of the show. But no later than the recording cut-off date of November 30th.* The point accumulation year for Year-End Performance Awards runs from **December 1st the previous year through November 30th.**

Point Standings: The point standings will be printed *in* the NASS Newsletter Quarterly Updates. Year End Performance Award winners will be printed in the annual NASS Newsletter.

Sport Horse In Hand: Only In Hand classes for Breeding or Sport Horses at Hunter, Dressage or Sport Horse Shows will be eligible to earn points for this category, unless the show program/prize list specifies that classes will be judged as sport horse classes. Classes must be judged as Sport Horse classes.

Sport Horse Under Saddle: Only Sport Horse Under Saddle classes for Sport Horses at Hunter or Dressage or Sport Horse Shows will be eligible to earn points for this category, unless the show program/prize list specifies that classes will be judged as sport horse classes. Classes must be judged as Sport Horse classes.

Combined Driving: This section still being developed, but we give awards for accomplishment in this area.



Combined Training: This system gives credit for completion of an event, for placing ahead of other horses *that* finished, for placement at the event, and for the division in which one competed (since requirements become progressively more difficult). Thus, a horse competing in the Preliminary Division earns more points per event than one competing in Beginner Novice.

ADD points for the DIVISION in which the horse competed as follows:

- Beginner Novice – 0 Points
- Novice – 5 Points
- Training – 10 Points
- Preliminary – 20 Points
- Intermediate – 40 Points
- Advanced – 80 Points

Points awarded will then be 10% of total points calculated.

A) This point schedule will not apply to ALL DIVISIONS given above.

B) Beginner Novice, which is NOT sanctioned by the USCTA, will earn the same points as an unsanctioned Horse trial, even though the Beginner Novice division may have been held in conjunction with a USCTA sanctioned event.

C) Points will be given for all events, but a horse MUST FINISH in order to earn any points. All horses will earn completion points even if they did not place in the top five, as well as bonus points for horses which finished with HIGHER penalty points or were eliminated, and points for the division in which they competed. If enough horses enter an event to cause divisions to be split into two or more sections, bonus points will be given ONLY for horses placing lower in the section in which one competed. However, in order to earn PLACEMENT POINTS; for 5th place, at least six (6) horses must have started; for 4th place at least five (5) horses must have started and so on.

D) Since there is not yet sufficient participation in Combined Training to give separate Year-End Performance Awards for each division, all points earned during the year will be combined for final computation for placement for the Combined Training Award.

Endurance Riding FEI:

Points may be accumulated in endurance and/or competitive trail competition. Points may be earned on sanctioned rides which require mandatory veterinary supervision during the entire competition. The Award will be a high point award. Separate categories for Junior and/or weight divisions will be considered for addition to NASS as participation increases.

Points Schedule

Completion Points: Earned for completing entire course of a ride and passing all veterinary criteria. Horse does not have to place. 1/2 point per mile.

Placement Points: Earned for placing First through Sixth in any ride.

Placement Points

First Place	25 points
Second Place	20 points
Third Place	15 points
Fourth Place	10 points
Fifth Place	5 points
Sixth Place	2 points

There must be at least 7 finishers in order to earn points for 6th place, 6 finishers in order to earn points for 5th place and so on. Best Condition earns 10 Points. Points awarded will then be 10% of total points calculated.

Mile Recognition

Along with yearly high point's awards, mileage recognition will be given per 500-mile increments completed during years member has belonged to and nominated with NASS. Miles will be accumulated as actual miles ridden and completed successfully. Development of this award for points will be addressed as member participation warrants.



Dressage Awards and Points Schedule: Because dressage competitors earn scores, as well as placing in their classes, the points schedule is different for this category. This system recognizes excellent PERFORMANCE by being based on percentage scores earned for individual dressage tests. All percentages count. In addition, it recognizes excellence in COMPETITION by multiplying the percentage by a weighting factor should the test have earned a 1st through 4th place in the class being recorded. Computation is shown below and all points will be rounded off to two decimal points.

Percentage scores earned at competitions should be reported at least three places beyond decimal.

Examples:

A rider placing 2nd in a class at an unrecognized show with a score of 60.00% would receive 2.40 points from NASS (.04 x 60.00= 2.40).

A rider scoring 51.00% at a recognized show who did not place in the class would receive .51 points from NASS (.01 x 51.00= .51).

A rider placing first in a class at a recognized show with a score of 59.55% would receive 3.57 points from NASS (.06 x 59.55= 3.573).





Meritorious Sire:

Meritorious Dam:

These categories are open to any horse registered with NASS which has sired or produced offspring enrolled in the NASS Year End Performance Award Program as long as the horse's owner remains a member in good standing. Points are figured when a horse enters the program and at the end of the year thereafter. Once an owner enters a horse in this program, points will be awarded automatically each year. This includes deceased horses whose offspring continue to be awarded points. Point totals will be updated annually in the Sire and Dam Roll.

Participating offspring in each division category will earn a minimum of 5 points for first place, 4 points for second place, etc. etc., for its sire or dam, when there are 5 or less horses in a division. (Example: 3 horses in a division: first place earns 5 points, second place earns 4 points, third place earns 3 points).

If a division has more than 5 horses, the first place horse will earn the number of points, for its sire or dam, equal to the number of horses in a division. The second place horse will earn one less point, etc. etc., to the final horse earning one point for its sire or dam. (Example: 7 horses in a division: first place earns 7 points, second place earns 6 points, third place earns 5 points, etc. etc., and the final horse in the division earns 1 point.)



Radautzer Award:

Recognition will be given annually to the horse who achieves the highest number of points within that competition year according to the scoring system (see Radautzer Awards Points Calculation Table form below). Eligible horses must be registered with NASS and the owner of record must be a NASS member in good standing at the time the nomination form is submitted.
