The Salt Lake Deanery is happy to report that all of our Affiliates are reactivated now. A couple are still struggling to get their full participation again. The rest are doing well

St Olafs Parish CCW stays quite busy keeping their members engaged. They had their Annual Ladies Luncheon Fundraiser in Oct with 110 in attendance. They promoted Council Sunday in conjunction with the luncheon. They were able to replenish their funds to continue their ministry and promote Council. They are in the process of revamping their funeral reception committee to provide ready-to-eat meals rather than potluck, to make serving and cleanup easier and more sustainable with volunteers.

The Catholic Women's League started meeting again in person. They had a great outdoor beginning social at Canyon Rim Park. It was very successful. Their meetings are held every fourth Tuesday of the month at the Vaughan Center. They do plan to have the Membership Tea and Fall Luncheon next year.

The Cathedral of the Madeline planned its first in-person gathering in over 18 months for October 9th. Sadly, no one attended, although two members had scheduling conflicts. On November 20th, they are trying again with Father Martin Diaz as a guest speaker, talking about the Synod. Amy ended her report with the Prayer for the Membership of the National Council of Catholic Women.

St Marguerites have started their monthly Sunday Breakfasts again. They participated in the Parish Fall Festival. They also put together weekend food bags for the homeless children in the Tooele School area.
