# A.A.D.A.A. Goals & Purposes

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- Become aware of the substance abuse problem in our society and how it affects our families, communities, and ourselves.
- Become informed as to the facts – and be ready to dispel the myths – about alcohol and other drug use so that the subject can be freely discussed within the family unit and in and community settings.
- Recognize that the role of community members and parents requires responsible behavior and clear positions regarding alcohol and other drug use in our own family and within the community.
- Help youth become, capable adults by providing opportunities that promote self-image and critical life skills.
- Encourage and sponsor creative social activities that are drug-free settings.
- Encourage parents to host well-supervised parties for youth that limit the number of guests to a controllable number and work to develop family standards that prohibit the use of alcohol and drugs by adolescents in the home at any time.
- Provide opportunities that allow families to communicate with legal, medical agencies, social service agencies, and with other families so that a consistent message concerning youth behavior is established within the community.
- Support school and law enforcement policies regarding the use of alcohol and other drugs by persons within the community and encourage appropriate and consistent consequences.
- Request and endorse comprehensive prevention programs for grades Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> that deal with alcohol and other drugs in the local school system.

**Poster Contest Guidelines**



**Who can participate?**

All students in kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades who attend public, private, parochial schools, home schooled, members of any youth organization, ie. Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Boys and Girls Clubs, etc are eligible to participate.

**Annual Themes (based on school year):**

**2022-2023:** There is no use for Drug Abuse

**2023-2024:** Be Smart...Don't Start

**Contest rules:**

- All students must address the theme.
- Entries **must be 9" x 12" inches** using construction paper or poster board.
- All entries must be free hand drawings and may be colored with any art medium.
- A straight edge may be used as an aid to draw a straight line.
- Gluing pictures or other materials to the surface of the drawing is **not permitted**.
- The student's description of the poster **must be written on the back of the poster** in 50 words or less. Descriptions that are firmly attached to the back of the poster will also be accepted.
- All entries must be sent to the National Programs Department and postmarked no later than July 1st. (Post and Department deadlines may vary.)
- Incomplete Entry forms and non-legible address will be disqualified.

#### **Who can participate?**

All students in the 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades who attend public, private, parochial schools, home schooled, members of any youth organization, ie. Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Boys and Girls Clubs, etc are eligible to participate.

#### **Annual Themes (based on school year):**

**2022-2023:** There is no use for Drug Abuse

**2023-2024:** Be Smart...Don't Start

#### **Contest rules:**

- All students must address the theme.
- Essays must be typed in 12 Font, Times New Roman, and doubled spaced
- Essays/poems submitted by 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade must be 250 words or less.
- Essays/poems submitted by 9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade must be 350 words or less.
- All entries must be sent to the National Programs Department and postmarked no later than July 1st. (Post and Department deadlines may vary.)
- Incomplete Entry forms and non-legible address will be disqualified.
