#### The Four Advent Candles

The candles on an Advent wreath symbolize the Christian virtues of hope, peace, joy, and love, and represent the four weeks of Advent:

- **First candle**: The Prophecy Candle, which is blue, represents hope and the anticipation of Christ's coming
- Second candle: The Bethlehem Candle, which is blue, symbolizes peace and preparation
- Third candle: The Shepherd's Candle, which is pink, represents the joy felt at the birth of Christ
- Fourth candle: The Angel's Candle, which is blue, represents love



Advent wreaths also often have a white candle in the center, called the Christ candle, which symbolizes the birth of Jesus and the arrival of Christmas. The Christ candle is lit on Christmas Eve. The circular shape of the wreath represents God's infinite love and eternity, while the evergreen leaves symbolize the hope of eternal life.
