"Christians and Debt"

"So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and <u>overflowing with thankfulness</u>." Colossians 2:6-7

"...I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am." Philippians 4:11

November is the month of Thanksgiving. As Colossians 2:6-7 reminds us, a spirit of thanksgiving should be a virtue demonstrated by every Christian. One evidence of genuine thankfulness is a spirit of contentment. In Philippians 4 Paul is talking about a financial and material contentment.

We live in an age of material discontent. In the last fiscal year the US government spent \$3.13 trillion more than it took in. Much of that was due to the coronavirus relief package. Most economists acknowledge that this extra spending was necessary to sustain the economy in this perilous time. Yet this spending has help to balloon the national debt to over \$21 trillion, which amounts to 102% of our Gross Domestic Product. The last time that this debt ratio was so large was the end of World War II. But then the country got serious about paying that debt down. There seems to be little concern nationally about doing that now.

I suspect that the government's example encourages the same attitude among its citizens. According to *USA Today* (2/12/2020), the average credit card balance among us Americans is \$6200. Forty-seven percent of credit card carriers maintain a monthly balance. The average interest rate is 17.73%. That amounts to a lot of money spent on interest over time.

Journalist Joel Belz notes, "...Christians, of all people, should understand that the Mastercard mentality is not the way to master life. The pattern Jesus established was one of deferring desires--- not because the fulfillment of desire is wrong, but because 'my time has not yet come." (World, 10/10/2020)

Sometimes those desires may not be legitimate. Sometimes we may want more that we should have, or than may be good for us to have. Pastor Tim Keller reminds us, "Jesus warns people far more often about greed than about sex, yet almost no one thinks they are guilty of it." (*Counterfeit Gods*, p. 53)

In this Thanksgiving season, let's be thankful for what we have, rejoice when we get more than we deserve, and be generous when we can.


