Just bring those items directly to the \$1, \$3 or \$5 tables. Baked goods will have a separate sales area.

Don't forget to bring a check or cash to pay for your basket purchases. Only cash will be accepted at the flat-rate tables. So even if you are not able to donate a basket, you can help support the club with your purchases — and have a great opportunity to jump-start your holiday gift-giving.
