In addition to the listed statute, some jurisdictions may charge the offender with a Class 4 felony, impersonating a police officer.

(720ILCS 5/17-2) False Impersonation; use of title; solicitation, certain entities.

(a) A person commits a false impersonation when he or she falsely represents himself or herself to be a member or representative of any veterans' or public safety personnel organization or a representative of any charitable organization, or when any person exhibits or uses in any manner any decal, badge or insignia of any charitable, public safety personnel, or veterans' organization when not authorized to do so by the charitable, public safety personnel, or veterans' organization. "Public safety personnel organization" has the meaning ascribed to that term in Section 1 of the Solicitation for Charity Act.
