MEETING ADJOURED: at 9:00 p.m. Motion to adjourn was made and approved.



MEMBER PROJECTS AND PROBLEM SOLVING




After our restoration clinic dealing with the the braking system and learning about the benefits of the cast iron drums that are readily available today I decided to work my way towards better brakes. Thank you Steve Barnacle and Dave Peterson for putting that clinic on! . I did have an extra set of rear backing plates that would fit my car that needed rebuilding and I also had 8 extra brake shoes bands that could interchange into my car once relined. Being winter and not having a lot to do and needing a project I ordered brake drums, had the hubs installed and began the rebuilding process. I wanted to do a quick exchange leaving my car down for the least amount of time once the driving season comes. That's why I kept these cores around knowing they take a series of steps to rebuild. I will be installing Ted's Floaters a new popular brake enhancement that Mike Sweeny from our club has demonstrated and one time pooled interest for a bulk purchase order saving me some money as well as others in the club. Well the time has come and the work has begun. My bands have been relined and the rear drum shoes have been arced to each drum. The rear roller tracks have been built up and filed down. Parts orders for the rollers, pins, links, springs and dust caps have come in and a tap has been run thru the adjuster threads to make a silky smooth adjustment when called for. The plates have been bead blasted and painted, new bushings installed and reamed with the aid of the club's reamer. My front backing plates will require much less work since I have previously done work to them. The front cast iron drums are now waiting to have the shoes arced to them.

This whole process is time consuming and "fussy" since you want to end up with good results. Taking my time, cleaning every thing and pre fitting items and checking for problems takes planning and care. The backing plates are of an awkward shape and holding them on the work bench is a challenge. I decided to make a small fixture out of scrap steel tubing, angle iron, a few bolts and a little bit of welding. This fits into my vice on the workbench and allows me to work on either the front or rear plate in the best position that makes it easy for me to accomplish my tasks of tapping, weld build up, weld filing, cleaning, installation and adjustment. I feel that this fixture is very important for me to see any potential binds or miss adjustments of items before placed on the car. It sits in good light on the bench and close to my tools. I also borrowed another tool from the club that allows you to easily install the brake shoe springs, without this tool it is a hard task. I liked that tool so much I decided that I wanted one for my self. I copied the tool and with a little bit of scrap steel and some cutting, grinding and a little welding made my own.

Making the tools is rewarding and solves the problem of having it when you need it. The clubs tool loan program is a great resource so make sure you use it. Certain tools like reamers, spring spreaders and some others you just don't use often enough to merit the investment. When I finish this project in the spring when my car comes out of storage I will be donating the backing plate fixture to the club. If someone needs it before then give me a call.
