Friends of Tettegouche State Park: Not Just for Tourists

Friends of Tettegouche State Park have had to reformulate their plans for connecting with community this year due to Covid-19. It's been an unusual year with Tettegouche's visitor center closed, the park's crew pared back, and record high numbers of visitors.

The pandemic has stymied plans for tree planting projects, in-person scavenger hunts, "park day", and live music events, but FTSP has gone on with planning for the future.

Morris Manning, Friends of Tettegouche board member, is hopeful that a natural playground project may still get underway in the next few months.

Natural playgrounds are gaining popularity around the country, with an eye toward non-plastic components, such as a log as a balance beam, and tree slabs for hopscotch.

Manning says fostering a connection between local residents and the park is a critical part of their mission, and one that perhaps has been historically overlooked.

"There's a perspective in the area that the park belongs to the tourists, and that's a perspective we hope to combat by having events that bring local people in and not just catering to those passing through to build that connection, to build a bridge," Manning stated.

Friends of Tettegouche State Park (FTSP)

formed as a non-profit partner of the park in 2017 with the mission of building a bridge between the local community and the park.

Jill Beim is president of FTSP, and she is looking forward to a time that they can bring local students to the park for programs that match curriculum standards.

"I want to provide more educational opportunities for kids, and right now during Covid we are going to plan that out, and be ready to jump in with both feet," said Beim.

Beim says that in collaborating with park staff on the playground design, they will also incorporate elements in consideration of children with disabilities, and have long-term plans to develop a handicap accessible multi-sensory trail.

A new website has debuted, including digital scavenger hunts that can be downloaded to a phone and followed like a paper checklist, but with full-color photographs and identification hints for topics like woodland flowers.

Able to access grant opportunities as a nonprofit that the park cannot, Manning says that financial support for additional programming is a vital part of the FTSP.

"State park friends groups provide a link with citizens where they wouldn't necessarily have a voice, and can bring money in

with state parks gradually starved for funding already," Manning stated.

Pre-pandemic FTSP sponsored a Winterfest at Tettegouche that drew over 100 people, and funded, organized, and brought in volunteers to plant over 250 trees. Post-pandemic they are excited to plan summer concerts, habitat restoration and removing invasive species.

Beim says that when it's safe they will be back together at the park, but in the meantime they will continue to brainstorm virtual events that will keep park visitors engaged.
