Reminder with the weather warming up and the days getting longer that our neighbors will be enjoying the outdoors and open windows. Please be courtesous of your neighborhood make sure your outdoor animals have proper shelter, food, water and remember we have a Noisy Animal ordinance:

2-112 The keeping, or harboring of any animal which by loud, frequent and habitual barking, howling, yelping, meowing, roaring or screeching shall disturb the peace of any neighborhood is hereby prohibited. It shall be the duty of any person harboring or keeping such loud or noisy animal or animals to abate the condition, and if he or she fails to do so, the city may abate it by taking up, impounding, and/or disposing of the animal at the expense of the owner. (Code 2017)



#### **Water Project Update**

We have received and awarded bids. We are happy to announce we are moving on to the next stage of the project. You might be seeing extra people in the area getting some measurments and extra information to keep the project rolling! To recap the City of Moran was among 40 rural communities to be awarded the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in the amount of \$450,000.00. In

addition to \$77,000.00 from The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and a \$373,000.00 matching KDHE loan. These resources will be going towards updating 12,000 linear feet of our water supply system.



#### **STORM Shelter & SIREN Policy**

Moran's warning sirens are audibly tested each day at noon, weather permitting. On Tuesdays at noon Allen County 911 tests the sirens for 30 seconds to ensure the warning system is working correctly. Moran has two above ground storm



shelters; one is located behind City Hall with the second located at the City Park. On occasion, technicians may test individual sirens at random times. In the event a tornado warning is declared for Allen County sirens are sounded for three continuous minutes with a 10 second pause between each alert. Additionally, the Moran Fire Department may use the sirens to alert volunteer firemen when fire calls are received.

#### Sirens are sounded as follows

- <u>DAILY</u>—all sirens sounded for 10 seconds at Noon Monday through Friday
- <u>TORNADO</u>—sirens sound continually for 3 minutes with a 10 second pause between sirens
- CITY FIRE—sirens sound once for 10 seconds
- <u>RURAL FIRE</u>—sirens sound twice for 10 seconds each
