## Minutes - Junior Meeting, August, 2023

The juniors have kept busy this summer. A couple of our families were able to join the Hermiston Hatrockhounds Junior Club for their geocaching session in July, which was so much fun! We also met up in July for a picnic and rock swap.

For the August meeting we started on the "Earth in Space" badge by learning about the scale and size of the solar system using the Hanford Reach Solar System Model. This scale model of the sun and planets is centered at the Solar Arches sculpture at the REACH Museum and sprawls out across the Tri-Cities area. We also used a giant map of Mars to compare its geologic features to those in eastern Washington. Both have lots of basalt, evidence of catastrophic flooding, and sand dunes. We will continue to work on this badge at the September 12 meeting as we learn about impact craters and look for micrometeorites.
