You may have noticed the tardiness of this newsletter. It may also have become apparent that there are no minutes for the August Club meeting. I had the unfortunate experience of complete PC collapse due to a combination of viruses and malicious software. The meeting minutes seem to have gotten lost in the Ethernet some where. If the hard copies show up I will run them in a future e-mail. Apparently I had a couple of viruses slowing things down and causing a few problems then this new problem entered the picture. WOW! major crash. I did learn some things that I want to pass-on. In spite of high security settings and two different security programs eventually a bug will get through.

This one acts, looks like, imitates a legitimate virus protection security warning from your own system. It takes you to a very real looking web site so you can 'buy' a product to protect and remove the suspect software/virus. To really scare you it lets you get to the internet but all you get is fake adult, porno and Viagra sites. The goal is to fool you into 'buying' using your credit card. The only thing that will really happen is the creators of this program will go shopping using your account.

Here are something you can do to protect your PC and wage a successful war if you find yourself engaged in the battle of wits with a virus/software attack.

Microsoft has a free scan program on their web site "Windows Live safety scanner is an online service that you can use for free spyware removal. Use it to scan your computer to help protect, clean, and keep your computer running at its best. Use the free scan to check for and remove viruses, spyware, and other potentially malicious software and to find vulnerabilities

or shortcomings in your Internet security." It is free and you can use it as often as you want. Here is the web address.

You can follow the links to contact support. They are very helpful. You may qualify for the free by phone and remote link to your PC help with a virus problem. I followed that link and established a help ticket. They solved the problem and remotely removed the offending software from the five places it was hiding. They also got rid of two other low impact viruses. It took a couple of hours to get through this but I had already spent 48 hours on my own efforts. I did not have to unplug the CPU and carry it someplace for service. Depending on each situation there may a charge for their service. My sister used it a couple of years ago and also had good results.

The bottom line is beware of pop up windows shouting credible warnings!


