

Commander's Corner... Post 346 Commander Marya Davis

Good News: We just received a \$20,000 Grant from Oakland County! Per that application, \$10,000 is committed to utilities and there will be some back-pay for our Clubroom Manager and a distribution for our three primary bartenders who all selflessly gave their time for the majority of the year to keep us together and the clubroom open. Money is also set aside for a sturdy exterior shelter so we can re-open for outdoor gatherings very soon. Together with the \$1,000 Grant from American Legion National, that gets us to June if there are no major repairs. This is far better than the previous expectation of having to shut down by February.

Reality: Leadership is looking for a smaller building to buy or space to lease that is more efficient and more manageable. Our building will be advertised for sale to give us time to pave the way to a more sustainable future.

In 1923, our Post started in a room in the east end of the Farmington Village Water Works building. From there, meetings were held in the basement of the Farmington National Bank (corner of Grand River Ave & Farmington Rd). In 1924 - A log cabin built for the Farmington Village Centennial Celebration was donated as the new home for Post 346 once festivities had ended. And then in 1929, we moved to a two-story house at 33109 Grand River Ave. (current location of the Downtown Farmington shopping center) purchased by members Howard & Harley Warner (sons of former Governor Fred M. Warner). In May 1945, land was purchased for our current location. In March 1948, the first meetings were held although construction was not yet complete. Finally, in 1949, construction was completed on our current location of 31775 Grand River Ave. We have been here for 71 years.

As I have said before, "we will not willingly give up on the intrinsic value of having a place to assemble which is essential to our human need for the camaraderie shared in our unique relationships founded on service and sacrifice. We choose to take action for the sake of our Legion family. Rather than being the victim of change, we choose to lean forward to evolve and adapt, to survive and thrive." Nothing is guaranteed due to COVID. But our duty to serve veterans, their families, and the community of Farmington, will endure! The generous GoFundMe donations from our community, the individual donations from our membership, support from the Auxiliary & SAL, and these grants provide us a sturdy bridge to continue our mission.

The days are getting longer and Queen of Hearts is starting again (see info on page 2). Let's celebrate and get together as soon as that new outdoor structure is set up! We can't roast marshmallows but maybe we can have some hot chocolate together!

Did You Know...?

The Green Beret wasn't part of the special forces uniform until 1961, after President Kennedy visited Fort Bragg and noticed an officer wearing one. Kennedy thought that members of this elite team needed something to distinguish them from other soldiers and made the green beret their official headgear. At Kennedy's funeral, Command Sergeant Major Francis Ruddy placed his beret on the president's grave, a tradition that Green Berets visiting Arlington National Cemetery continue today.

Kennedy's death also affected the 1963 Army-Navy football game. The nation was officially in mourning for 30 days, and holding the game would have been deemed disrespectful. But the president himself had been scheduled to attend, and the Kennedy family personally requested that it go on. JFK's beloved Navy won.

Holiday Wreath Laying

The Post wanted to be a good example to the community by not hosting a large gathering. Farmington American Legion gets a fundraising boost

11/12/20 by Joni Hubred - Farmington Voice Ask Farmington American Legion Groves-Walker Post Commander Marya Davis how she's doing these days, and you'll hear words like "ecstatic" and "excited." Just a few months ago, the Post struggled with the loss of rental revenues due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and members feared the doors might close for good. The iconic red brick building at 31775 Grand River has space to host weddings, private parties, and other community events, but even though it re-opened in June, capacity has been limited.

Veteran James Koponen was interviewed for a WJBK-TV segment that aired again this week. (fox2detroit.com) Now, though, the future looks brighter, thanks to a generous community, Davis said. A crowdfunding campaign launched over the summer is now within \$2,000 of its \$15,000 goal. The drive got a \$3,000 boost this week after WJBK-TV re-aired a segment on the Post's struggles. Support has also come from outside the Farmington area, she added. "A vet from the Garden City area walked into the clubroom last night and handed us a check for \$100." The Legion also organized a Queen of Hearts raffle, through which people purchased \$1 tickets for a chance to draw a card and split a large pot with the Club. After expenses, that brought in about \$3,000 which, coincidentally, covers about one month's worth of expenses. "We will start that again in January," Davis said. "I learned a lot, it will be much better this time around."

Davis said the Post has avoided COVID-19 loans because members weren't sure they'd be able to repay them. While she has applied for some grants, most have been targeted to 501(c)3 nonprofits, and the group falls under a different classification.

While grateful for the outpouring of community support, Davis said, the Legion's most sustainable path forward is rental revenues. Capacity is currently limited to 30 people in the lower hall and 60 in the upper hall; both rooms offer plenty of space for groups to spread out.

Monday night dinners open to the public from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. (or while supplies last) also provide some support. Davis said the Club follows strict COVID-19 safety measures. "Our bartenders are still working for free as they have all summer long," she said, adding members have been generous with tips. "It's really up to all of us that we have this place for veterans and their families to gather."

Membership Eligibilty







<u>Legion membership eligibility</u>. Veterans or active duty military who have served at least one day of active duty in the US Armed Forces since December 7, 1941 and have been honorably discharged or are still serving.

<u>Auxilairy membership eligibility</u>. 1) Relationship to veteran: Mother, daughter, sister, grandmother, granddaughter, male or female spouse, self (for female veterans).

2) Potential member must be related to a living veteran by one of the relationships stated **AND** veteran is a current member of the American Legion. **OR**, Potential member is related to a deceased veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

SAL membership eligibility. 1) All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons. 2) Potential member must be related to a living veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion. OR, Potential member is related to a deceased veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

County delivers \$20K check to Farmington American Legion

December 19, 2020 by Joni Hubred - Farmington Voice Oakland County officials delivered an early Christmas gift Friday, in the form of a \$20,000 grant check for the Groves-Walker American Legion Post #346 in Farmington. Post Commander Marya Davis said funds will go toward utility payments and payroll, and to purchase a structure that will allow veterans to gather outdoors. State executive and health orders have closed the hall on Grand River to indoor dining and facility rentals, slashing revenues.

Since September, Post members have been fundraising through a GoFundMe campaign and Queen of Hearts raffle. Davis said veterans are often uncomfortable asking for help and need to interact with others who have had military experience. "These folks need the camaraderie of similar minded people," she said. "It's absolutely essential that we can create a safe space for them to come, so we can still bring them together."

County reaches out to vets

Oakland County Deputy Executive Sean Carlson, a U.S. Air Force veteran, said the grant funds came through the federal CARES (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) Act. Officials have distributed about \$90 million to small businesses and nonprofits. "We wanted to make sure we were taking care of veterans as well," he said. "They are a very important part of our community."

Oakland County Executive David Coulter said veterans have needs that are different from those of other citizens, and the county has been "aggressively reaching out" to them. "You would be struck by how many challenges they are facing because of this," he said. "We know that if you want to help veterans, working with the service organizations that know them the best and know their needs is the way to go."

Carlson said \$550,000 has been distributed among 31 veterans' organizations, and more than \$750,000 has gone to veterans themselves, with grants of up to \$2,500 helping them through hardships caused by COVID-19. The individual checks went out Friday to more than 500 veterans.

Coulter added that, while the Board of Commissioners is split politically, votes to allocate the CARES Act funds to residents in need have been unanimous.

Your best bet when seeking veteran discounts with your favorite stores, restaurants or services:

- 1) Always ask if you can get a veteran discount no matter where you shop or what services you seek.
- **2)** Not all stores in a national chain will give the same discounts because they may be individually owned and operated.
- 3) Each business you deal with is likely to ask for a different form of proof of service: a VA card (sometimes only a "combat related" disability designation), DD-214, veteran organization membership card, County veteran discount cards, veteran designation on driver's license, sometimes just wearing a veteran baseball cap will do! You'll never know unless you ask.

We know how hard it is to remember everything you need to take care of when a loved one passes away, and even harder to know what benefits a deceased veteran may be entitled to.

This is one reason why the American Legion has Service Officers, to help the deceased veteran's family receive all the benefits they may be entitled to. Always remember, and tell your loved ones -

- 1) Know where your DD-214 is. An American Legion service officer can help you get a replacement copy if lost.
- **2)** Tell your funeral director that the deceased was a veteran.
- 3) Contact your Post (or the nearest American Legion Post if your loved one was not a member), and not only can you receive the help of a Service Officer but, the Post's Honor Guard can help with a military funeral service. Other benefits might include a free burial plot, headstone, survivor benefits, burial expenses, and an American flag to drape the casket.
