From the Pulpit,

My Beloved ... what a crazy busy last few months that we have had. I have to start by saying how proud I am to be your pastor. The way I have witnessed you give to those who are in need, both physically and emotionally, over the past few months has been heartwarming to see. We have talked a great deal about being the body of Christ in action in our families and in our communities and that is what I have seen you all doing. I am beyond proud of your efforts.

As we enter this Lenten season, let us keep a couple very important things in mind. First, it is not wrong to give something up for Lent, but that tradition is meant to simulate a sacrifice on our parts to honor the sacrifice made by Christ. So, giving up chewing gum for 40 days is not something that should be considered worthy. If you plan on engaging in this traditional practice and choose to give something up, it should be something that will be extremely hard for you to do. Christ gave up his life for us, so nothing we can give up will truly compare to that, but it should honor that sacrifice of Christ.

Secondly, the season of Lent is a journey. It's a journey where mankind's failure is illuminated quite extensively. It's also a journey that despite mankind's failure, Jesus out of His love for all of us, gave up all that He had. Jesus held nothing back ... He gave His life in order to give us a path to salvation and an eternity with Our Father in Heaven. This is the biggest sacrifice ever made in the History of the world. This journey over these 40 days is an emotional roller-coaster to say the least. But I challenge you to take that journey as the body of Christ with me ... be excited about the great things that you will see. Be saddened and sickened by the sadness and despair you see as well. Allow yourself to travel through lent and try to experience the magnificence of this season. Its ok to be sad during this time ... but I challenge you to be more introspective this season than you have ever been before. As the body of Christ ... Go where He went, experience what He experienced, and learn the lesson of true love taught to us as He goes to the cross for all of us. Although this can be a very sad season at many of the turns in this journey it ends in utter jubilation as Christ defeats death. That resurrection gives us hope. Hope that we will one day be united with Our Father in Heaven because of the sacrifice of his Son ... The Savior of the world.

So, My Beloved, buckle up and let's go for a ride together ... one that hopefully, can never leave us the same. Amen?
