Hello Everyone!

I was recently reading a biography of a famous rock star. He told stories about how he was inspired to become a musician, how he got his breaks and those lucky opportunities to be seen and heard, and those moments in life where he knew success was

happening. He also told many stories about meeting his heroes, legends who came before him and inspired him. He talked about how nervous he would be, how great they were in his encounters, and even how some became lifelong friends with him.

I do not think I have met anyone famous, not that I can recall. I have certainly never met a movie star whose movies I watch, a musician whose music I listened to, or a famous athlete I watch on television. I have never sought out those encounters. I think it is because I always wondered, "Are they going to be who I think they will be?" Are they going to be as nice, or cool, or amazing as I think they are? Are they going to be boring, rude, or even mean?

> And it made me wonder, what would it mean to meet Jesus? Would it feel like being in the presence of a celebrity or a royal dignitary? Would the room fall into absolute silence, with gasps in the air? Would everyone rush to him in a mob, trying

to get a picture with him or shake his hand? Would everyone tell him just how great he is and try to impress him with their fandom. (Jesus, I am your biggest fan!) Would everyone expect him to do something or say something profound?

Would meeting Jesus meet my expectations or disappoint them? Can your heroes be everything you dream they could be?

The disciple Thomas had that same dilemma. Jesus had died, much to the surprise of many. The hero they had followed for a few years had willingly gone to his death instead of using his power to escape. Thomas felt disappointed, as had many others. Now, news from his friends is rushing everywhere: Jesus is reborn! Jesus has come back from the dead, and we have seen him!

For Thomas, he is not sure. He is not sure that Jesus is going to match his expectations. That meeting the risen Jesus is going to be worth it. We see this play out in John 20:25-28.

So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"

Thomas was unsure about meeting his hero again, this time as the risen Savior he said he would be. Thomas came to believe that all that he dreamed Jesus would be, he indeed was. Even though he had formed a great friendship with Jesus, this meeting was different. Thomas now had expectations and was afraid of his heart getting hurt by a disappointing encounter. Jesus exceeded his expectations.

You and I have a relationship with Jesus, but what would it be like to meet him

in person? Do you have expectations of what it would look like? Are you afraid that, in some way, that meeting might be disappointing? Take courage in the fact that in the story of Thomas, we can place ourselves in that position, wondering if this is going to be everything we dream it would be. As Thomas came to exclaim, "My Lord and my God!", may we have the same confidence. Jesus is everything he says he is and what we put our faith and hope in. He will meet our expectations, and in many ways, exceed them. I cannot wait to meet him in Heaven one day, and I hope you are just as excited as I am!

Missions Update

This month I am going to emphasize Samaritan's Purse. When we think of Samaritan's Purse, we tend to think of Operation Christmas Child and the shoeboxes first, but that is only one aspect of their ministry. The following comes from their September update from Franklin Graham.

"In our work, Samaritan's Purse has to be prepared for the worst. In the last few weeks, we've responded to a Category 4 hurricane and earthquake in Haiti, a refugee crisis in Afghanistan, wildfires in California, and the latest Covid outbreak."

I was amazed to learn that this ministry is so varied and reaches so many needs yearround. Also, I found out that though we think of Christmas shoeboxes at Christmas time, they deliver boxes worldwide and year-round. Each child receiving a shoebox is introduced to Jesus and is discipled. This introduction to Jesus frequently leads to the salvation of a whole family.

When I left church on October 24th, there were already 20 boxes stacked by the pulpit. There are still boxes available in the office daily. The last day to bring to church is November 14th.

As this Press comes out, we will have had a most welcome visit from Steve Robinson, one of our missionaries who serves with Mission Aviation Fellowship. It was good to see and hear from him. Our prayers continue for Mary Hopkins, Betty Barnett, Russ Douglass, Steve Robinson, and the Moyers in France.
