Open Burning Law & Recreational Fires

As summer is in full swing and everyone is looking to enjoy the outdoors, the Painesville City Fire Department has seen an increase in the amount of calls received about open burning complaints.

As a reminder, open burning is prohibited in Painesville City except as defined in Ordinance 560.08. Open burning is allowed

- Heating tar, welding acetylene torches, highway safety flares, heating for warmth of outdoor workers and strikers, smudge pots and similar occupational needs,
 - Bonfires (by permit),

campfires and outdoor fireplace equipment, whether for cooking food for human consumption, pleasure, religious, ceremonial, warmth, recreational or similar following purposes, if the conditions are met:

- o Fuel must be either clean, seasoned firewood, natural gas or equivalent, or any clean burning fuel with emissions that are equivalent to or lower than those created by burning seasoned firewood;
- o Fires cannot be used for waste disposal purposes
- o Fires must not exceed 3 feet in diameter or 2 feet in height.

o Must be at least 25ft from a structure (50ft for bonfires)

o Fires must be attended (cannot be left abandoned) and an extinguishing agent (garden hose or similar) is required.

Please do not burn trash, old furniture, etc. This is an illegal activity and may result in a citation. PCFD will respond to complaints of open burning and will enforce City Ordinances. Be considerate of your neighbors and burn clean, seasoned firewood that does not make objectionable smoke, so that everyone can safely enjoy their summertime outdoor activities!

Work Zone Safety from the Public Works Perspective

Painesville Public Works employees very rarely work indoors. They deal with rain, snow, hot, cold and everything in between in Northeast Ohio!

During the summer months, employees are out performing essential services such as maintaining streets, cleaning and repairing catch basins, roadkill disposal and repairing the City's sewer infrastructure. Most of the crew's daily activities are done in the actual roadway or along the edge of the road.

To ensure the safety of our dedicated workers we need your help. Please stay alert and minimize distractions, follow other vehicles at a safe distance, slow down when you see a work zone, look for instructions from flaggers, be aware of road workers as you drive through the work

zone, proceed cautiously and most importantly, please be patient.

With your help, we can all enjoy a safe and happy summer! Thank you for helping keep us safe.

Attitudes are Changing Towards Insurance

The events of the past year have created a great deal of uncertainty in many of our lives. You will need to decide on the type, length, and amount of coverage you need. While there are many types of Life Insurance, two basic types are Term and Whole Life Insurance.

Term Life Insurance is an affordable way to provide basic protection. Term Life Insurance lasts a certain number of years, then ends. If the insured dies during the period specified in the policy and the policy is active, or in force, a death benefit will be paid. Unlike most types of permanent insurance, term insurance has no cash value.

Whole Life Insurance provides financial protection but also includes a savings/investment component in addition to the death benefit. Unlike Term Insurance a Whole Life policy remains in effect for the life of the insured if the premiums are paid. Over time Whole Life Insurance builds cash value which can be accessed in the event of emergencies.

the difference? General electrical work in Ohio does not require licensing. Specifically, only commercial contractors in Ohio need a license to work. Electrical contractors are licensed by the state and can install, repair, or alter all forms of electrical equipment.

In Ohio, you need five years of experience with a licensed electrician before you can apply for an electrical contractor license. There are a few ways that

you can gain that experience. You could work as an apprenticeship for a few years, attend trade school and apply for entry-level positions, or simply climb the industry ladder in your local area. Apprenticeships teach you the basics of electrical wiring, equipment usage, and electrical theory.

Donors Support Lakeland Students to Keep Workforce Strong Donor support is helping Lakeland education to prepare graduates with their studies, the college has focused in 2015 the college has focused.

Donor support is helping Lakeland Community College students stay on track to earn their credentials and fill a shortage of qualified workers in our community.

Economists project that most jobs in Ohio will require a postsecondary credential by 2025. Lakeland is a critical provider of job training and

education to prepare graduates with the skills local employers need for the jobs of the future. Ninety-seven percent of Lakeland graduates live or work in our community, providing local employers with a pipeline of skilled workers who are ready for immediate employment.

To help more students complete

their studies, the college has focused on creating a campus experience that increases student success. This includes providing financial assistance, student support services, student engagement programs, and emergency needs funding to keep students on the path to earning their degrees or certificates.

In 2015, the college's philanthropic arm, The Lakeland Foundation, launched a \$10 million campaign for scholarships and programs to support Lakeland student success and future economic growth.

"Our students face unique challenges which often prevent them from pursuing a college education or finishing once they have begun," said Greg Sanders, Lakeland vice president for institutional advancement and executive director of The Lakeland Foundation. "Thanks to donors to the Futures Rising campaign, we are creating a campus experience that improves students' success in college, careers and life."

Over the past five years, 1,342 donors contributed \$10.7 million to the Lakeland Foundation's Futures Rising Campaign, surpassing its goal. About \$4 million was raised for innovative programs to support student success and enhance the campus experience. Programs include diversity initiatives, arts and cultural experiences, leadership opportunities, and other cocurricular activities.

Studies show that the more actively engaged students are - with college faculty and staff, with other students, with the subject matter they are studying - the more likely they are to persist in their college studies and to achieve at higher levels.

Learning experiences, like the Lakeland Honors Program, provide opportunities for students to engage with other classmates and gain valuable skills. Designed to foster leadership development, the honors program offers opportunities for service, travel and social activities while providing an excellent and challenging academic experience.

"I've learned more than just from the hard classes I take in the honors program," said Bradley Gartner, a traditional aged student pursuing his Associate of Science degree. "I've gained diverse perspectives and leadership and teamwork skills that I wouldn't have attained otherwise."

The campaign also raised more than \$2.5 million to provide scholarships for students who need help paying tuition to finish college and gain access to better jobs. While Lakeland's tuition is one of the lowest in the state, more than half of students receive some form of financial assistance.

Scholarships are awarded to students like Kristina Shapiro, a mother of three who worked part-time while studying at Lakeland to become a nurse. "The scholarship helped me to afford the last year of nursing school," said Shapiro, who earned her Associate of Applied Science degree this spring.

During the pandemic, when many students lost their jobs, The Lakeland Foundation focused its fundraising efforts on emergency funds and the Lakeland Cares Cupboard food pantry. Emergency funds provide support for students' most basic needs, such as food, transportation and child care. The Foundation's Immediate Needs Grant is available to students who encounter an unexpected financial hardship in paying for expenses that is preventing them from completing the semester.

Bankruptcy 10

The two types of bankruptcy that most people hear about are chapter 7 and chapter 13. The word chapter refers to the chapter (like in a book) in the bankruptcy code. Chapter 7 is a liquidating bankruptcy and chapter 13 is a non-liquidating bankruptcy. Liquidating means they (the government) can take your stuff. Non-liquidating means they can't. However, there are exceptions to this. I will try to lay this out in a simplistic fashion:

In a chapter 7 you will be able to discharge all of your debts without paying anything back. However, if you have any equity in anything (your home, your car, your bank account, your boatanything) you must surrender it to the bankruptcy trustee (the person who looks out for the creditors) so that it can be sold (liquidated) to pay back the creditors to the largest extent possible. Equity is what determines which chapter of bankruptcy you can file under. Fair Market Value minus Amount Owed equals Your Equity in anything.

A chapter 13 is a non-liquidating bankruptcy. This means you get to keep everything, but you have to pay back a percentage of your equity. It is also used for people who are in foreclosure or

behind on their mortgage and in fear of foreclosure. A chapter 13 requires a payback plan from between three to five years. The payment is monthly. The amount is determined, again, by the amount of equity you have accumulated in your life. This is referred to as your bankruptcy estate. Obviously, everyone wants to do a chapter 7 because it is no pay back. However, since 2005 it has become much harder to file chapter 7. In 2005, legislation was passed which tightened up the income restrictions on people with regard to the Chapter 7 bankruptcy. The intended result was that more people must file under Chapter 13 of the Bankruptcy code and pay back, at least, what the government thinks they can afford.

It is the bankruptcy attorney's job to advise you which is the best chapter to file under. It is also the attorney's job to make sure you keep your home, your car, and everything else you have accumulated throughout your life.

A good bankruptcy attorney will do those all of those things. He or She will also stop the creditors from harassing you, protect you from lawsuits, garnishments, put you back on your feet and give you a fresh start in life.




