Relating to Elders

A car runs smoothly only when every part properly relates to the other parts. Likewise, the church properly functions as the body of Christ only when every member relates to the other members according to God's design (I Cor. 12:12-31; Eph. 2:13-22).

One relationship that is essential to godly functioning of the church is the elder-member relationship. For us to properly relate to our elders God says we must allow them to do the following: 1. episkopeo, proistemi -- oversee, guard, superintend, or see that we do our work correctly (Acts 20:28; Phil. 1:1; Titus 1:7; I Tim. 3:2,4; I Thess. 5:12)

- 2. oikonomos -- administer, steward, manage, or direct the affairs of the church (Titus 1:7)
- 3. epimeleomi -- care for, or make provisions for us (I Tim. 3:5)
- 4. hegeomi -- rule, lead, preside over, govern, or guide us (Heb. 13:17)
- 5. parakaleo -- encourage us with sound teachings (Titus 1:9)
- 6. elegcho -- point out, convict, or correct us and others when we oppose sound teaching (Titus 1:9)
- 7. epistomizo -- silence false teachers among us (Titus 1:11)

In addition to our allowing the elders to do the above, God also commands we obey and submit to them (Heb. 13:17), honor them (I Tim. 5:17), hold them in highest regard (I Thess. 5:12,13), and receive not an accusation against them except at the mouth of two or more witnesses (I Tim. 5:19).

Let's relate to each other as God directs. Particularly, let us follow God's instructions and properly relate to our elders. --Bud Lambert--, edited for use in this bulletin

From the Elders:

The Bible teaches us to dress in "modest apparel" (1Tim. 2:9). We ask that everyone (male and female) follow these guidelines. We also ask that you encourage your friends who attend our services to do the same.

- Do not wear tops that show cleavage, that expose the back or that are strapless.
- Do not wear pants that are too tight, see through or have holes exposing your body.
- Do not wear skirts or dresses that are above the knee.
- Except for children pre-school and younger, no shorts are to be worn to worship. (This will teach our children to dress modestly and avoid future problems).
- The attire mentioned above should never be worn on the church grounds or in the building.
- Shorts at appropriate church related activities (cookouts, retreats, etc.) must be knee length.

The following relates to the worship: We ask that the men who lead avoid being too casual. Please dress in a way that shows the utmost reverence for God and respect for those you serve:

- Wearing a suit and/or tie is not required
- We ask that, if you are able to do so, your dress be "business casual" at least dress shirt and nice pants.
- Do not wear shirts that have pictures, images, team logos or messages on them.
- Do not wear sleeveless shirts or tank tops.
- Unless designed to be worn outside, do not wear your shirt with the tail out.
- Do not wear shoes without socks.
- Do not wear sandals.
- Do not wear faded jeans or jeans with holes in them.
