Pastor's Word

Happy New Year! The beginning of a new year is for many of us a time to look back, take stock, and think about making changes. Lots of folks make New Year's resolutions, but the follow through is often lacking. From my intensive research (I did a google search!), a reported 7-40% of resolutions are actually kept, with most sources reporting around 8-12%. A *Forbes* article reported that less than 25% stick to their resolution for even 30 days, and only 8% accomplish them. Why do so few people stick to their resolutions?

Part of the answer is that many/most of us make resolutions because it is the "thing to do," and deep down we may not be so invested in keeping them. Resolutions can be more like nice goals to have, or maybe even dreams.

And part of it is that resolutions are often things that we think we "ought" to do. Surveys show that the most common resolutions are to exercise more, eat healthier, lose weight, save more/spend less, and pursue a career ambition. Other common resolutions were to get organized, learn a new skill, read more, quit smoking, and even things like pray more. All of these may be good things, even wonderful things, but resolutions made from a sense of "oughtness" can feel like an obligation. It's no surprise that we burn out on keeping our New Year's resolutions.

I confess that I am not a big New Year's resolution person. Maybe because it seems a little arbitrary for January 1 to be the annual date to try to make a change. But an annual set day to take stock and make changes is better than never doing that at all. It seems to me that if we maintain a stance of openness — openness to others, openness to the world around us, and openness to listening to our own lives and our own hearts, we will be more open to making changes. When we resolve out of commitment and conviction and even joy, rather than obligation, it will be more likely to "take."

In a sense, when we gather for worship each week, part of what we are doing is taking stock and resolving to make changes. We don't often think of worship in that way. We want our gathering together to be comforting and encouraging, and hopefully it is. But when we truly encounter God in worship, the experience will change us. As we navigate what are difficult days in so many ways, this is something we very much need. As we begin this New Year, I am so grateful for this community of faith. I look forward to gathering together this Sunday in person or on Zoom.

From the Ames Tribune: "'It's a lifesaver': 99-year-old central Iowa man saves lives volunteering for Meals on Wheels."


