

## **Sunday Reflection: Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Why did Jesus perform the miracle of the great catch of fish? No doubt the great crowd of people who had pressed upon Jesus had something to do with this miracle. They were very hungry for God and were eager to hear his word. Jesus wanted to use this occasion to teach his disciples an important lesson. Although Simon was wearied from a night of fruitless toil, he nonetheless did what the Lord Jesus told him to do: At your word I will let down the nets. When we meet

disappointment and failure, do we press upon the Lord, like Simon, to hear his word and to receive his command? This incident tells us an important truth about how God works in and through each of us for his glory. God expects of us greater things than we can do by ourselves. When we cooperate in His works, we accomplish far beyond what we can do on our own.

God chooses ordinary people, like you and me, as his ambassadors and he uses the ordinary circumstances of our daily lives and work situations to draw others into his kingdom. Jesus speaks the same message to us today: we will "catch people" for the kingdom of God if we allow the light of Jesus Christ to shine through us. God wants others to see the light of Christ in us in the way we live, speak, and witness the joy of the Gospel. Do we witness to those around us the joy of the Gospel and do we pray for our neighbors, co-workers, and relatives that they may come to know the Lord Jesus Christ and grow in the knowledge of his love and truth?

# Frant of the Week: St. Agatha

St. Agatha, also known as Agatha of Sicily, is one of the most highly venerated virgin martyrs of the Catholic Church. She was born around 231 in Sicily to a rich and noble family. From her very early years, the beautiful Agatha dedicated her life to God.

Having consecrated her virginity to God at a young age, she resisted the advances of a Roman prefect sent by the emperor Decius to govern Sicily. Her profession of faith and rejection of the prefect resulted in her brutal torture, during which her breasts were cut off (a condition often reflected in her iconography). During her imprisonment, she famously had a vision of St. Peter the

Apostle, who is said to have comforted her and healed her wounds with his prayers. She was then sent to the stake, but according to some accounts, as soon as the fire was lighted, an earthquake occurred, causing the people to insist upon her release; she allegedly died in prison around the year 251.



## **Four Chaplains Memorial Service**

Each year on February 3, we celebrate Four Chaplains Day honoring four military chaplains who sacrificed their own lives to save the lives of fellow service members during WWII.

This year marks the 79th anniversary of the sinking of the U.S. Army Transport Dorchester while transporting troops to an American base in Greenland. A German U-boat fired a torpedo that struck the Dorchester, killing 672 of the 902 persons aboard. Many of the survivors owe their lives to the courage and leadership shown by four chaplains of different faiths. As the ship sank, the chaplains were seen linked arm in arm, praying.
