MARRIAGE IS ORDAINED BY GOD

Gen. 2:18-24; Psalm 128:1-6; Heb. 2:9-11; Mark 10:2-16

In the Book of Genesis 2:18, the Lord God said: "it is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him ... The Lord God then built up into a woman the rib that He had taken from the man. When He brought her to the man, the man said: 'This one...is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman'...That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife (woman), and the two of them become one flesh."

In the Judeo-Christian cultures and in many other cultures around the globe, marriage is celebrated as a sacred reality, and a special event. Marriage is a state of life ordained and sanctioned by God in the very act of creation itself. Thus, the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council in reflecting on this very mystery said: "The intimate community of life and love which constitutes the married state has been established by the Creator and endowed by Him with its own proper laws; it is rooted in the contract of its partners, that is, in their irrevocable personal consent. It is an institution confirmed by divine law...For God Himself is the author of marriage ... " (GS 48). If God, therefore, is the author of marriage, it is only Him Who has the sole right to alter it. Thus, our Lord and Teacher, Jesus Christ, warns us all: "Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." (Mark 10:9).

Sadly, this sacred institution has been under constant attack and pressure from generation to generation. It was challenged by the Jewish people, and broken down during the days of Moses. It was restored and elevated to the status of Sacrament by Christ, Who reminded the Pharisees, who guestioned Him about divorce, that Moses compromised the commandment of God "because of the hardness of your hearts." It was because of the weakness and selfishness of the Jewish people that Moses compromised the faith and the law of God. Even in today's society, judges, politicians, leaders of the people, like Moses, have unfortunately deviated from God's law in order to appease the electorate. It was not meant to be so, because "from the beginning...God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." In furthering our Lord's teaching, and also in summarizing the teaching of the Second Vatican Council, the Code of Canon Law defines marriage as, "The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses...the procreation...education of offspring; this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament." (Can. 1055:1).

In our fast changing world, many traditional values are guestioned and, unfortunately, are gradually replaced. Marriage, one of the most sacred and oldest institutions is currently under attack by the "new norm" of divorce - gay 'marriage' - co-habitation and so on. As we kickoff the "Year of Faith" this Thursday, October 11th, you and I are called to enrich our faith through prayer and introspection. We are called to live our faith by promoting and supporting the institution of marriage - pray for our young people who are contemplating marriage, husbands and wives, and especially newlyweds. Through the intercession of our Blessed mother Mary, pray that husband and wife may accept each other as "a little child" would - with humility and simplicity. May they bear with one another's inadequacies and thus ensure the unity and sacredness of marriage.

VATICAN II AND THE YEAR OF FAITH



The Year of Faith opens on October 11, 2012, the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council. Vatican II was a gathering of over 2,000 bishops from all over the world at St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City. The Council lasted from 1962 to 1965, during which time the Council Fathers, in cooperation with the Holy Spirit, strove to understand and articulate the mission of the Church

in the modern world.

The fruits of the Council took the form of 16 documents, which outlined the path for renewal in the Church. The documents ranged from Constitutions on the Sacred Liturgy and Divine Revelation to texts on Religious Liberty and Social Communication. It was the intention of the Council Fathers, as it is the intention for the Church on the threshold of the *Year of Faith*, to bring about authentic renewal in the Church so as to discover the way to bring the unchanging truth of Christ to a new era in human history.

Because the *Year of Faith* coincides so closely with the anniversary of the Council, the Pope has asked us to pay particular attention to the Vatican II documents, as they "have lost nothing of their value or brilliance" (Porta *Fidei*: 5). We are encouraged to be educated and evangelized through study and reflection upon these source documents, and to find in them the "sure compass by which to take our bearings in this century now beginning" (Porta Fidei: 5).



For life in the womb, coming from Your creative power;


For the life of children, making us glad with their freshness and promise;
