

Sunday Reflection – Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Do we believe that God's word has power to set us free and to transform our lives? When Jesus taught, he spoke with authority. He spoke the word of God as no one had spoken it before. When the Rabbis taught, they supported their statements with quotes from other authorities. The prophets spoke with delegated authority - 'Thus says the Lord.' When

Readings for Sunday, February 7, 2021 Job 7:1-4, 6-7

1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23 Mark 1:29-39

Jesus spoke, he needed no authorities to back his statements. He was authority incarnate - the Word of God made flesh. When he spoke, God spoke. When he commanded even the demons obeyed. Faith is powerful, but without love it profits nothing (1 Corinthians 13). Scripture tells us that true faith works through love (Galatians 5:6) and abounds in hope (Romans 15:13).

Faith is both a free gift of God and the free assent of our will to the whole truth that God has revealed. To live, grow, and persevere in the faith to the end, we must nourish it with the word of God. The Lord gives us his Holy Spirit to enlighten our minds that we may grow in his truth and in the knowledge of his great love for each of us. If we approach God's word with trust and submission, and with an eagerness to do what the Lord desires for us, then we are in a much better position to learn what God wants to teach us through his word. Let us pray: Lord Jesus, your word is power and life. May I never doubt your love and mercy, and the power of your word that sets us free, and brings healing and restoration to body, mind, heart, and spirit.



Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea, Armenia and a doctor. He was martyred in Sebastea in 316, but the legendary "Acts of St. Blaise" were written 400 years later.

According to those writings, Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. But because persecution still raged in Armenia, he was forced to flee to the back country where he lived as a hermit and made friends with the wild animals.



Feast Day: February 3

One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheater stumbled upon Blaise's cave. They were surprised and frightened; the bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by wolves, lions and bears. According to legend, as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone.

In another tale, Blaise was being led to the prison in Sebastea when they came across a poor woman whose pig had been stolen by a wolf. Blaise commanded the wolf to return the pig, which it did—alive and injured. The woman visited him in prison and brought two wax candles in an attempt to dispel the gloom of his darkened cell.

Saint Blaise is often depicted holding two crossed candles in his hand, or in a cave with wild animals. He is the patron saint of throat ailments and English wool combers.

The traditional blessing of throats will be given at both Masses next weekend.

Welcome His Excellency, The Most Reverend Mark Brennan!

Please join us in welcoming Bishop Mark Brennan for the first time to our Church of the Assumption!

A Boston native, Bishop Brennan attended public schools in Massachusetts and Maryland before entering St. Anthony High School in Washington, DC. He graduated from Brown University with a degree in history, and then entered Christ the King Seminary in Alleghany, New York for a year of philosophy before attending the Pontifical North American College in Rome for his theological studies.

A parish priest for nearly his entire career, Bishop Brennan was assigned to various parishes in Maryland and the District of Columbia for 40 years. He was appointed Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Baltimore at the end of 2016. His Episcopal Ordination was on January 19, 2017.

Additionally, Bishop Brennan attended Spanish language courses and Hispanic cultural studies in the Dominican Republic and in Colombia. He has also served as Director of Priestly Vocations in the Archdiocese of Washington.

He was named Bishop for the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston in 2019.

Bishop Brennan will celebrate both the Vigil and Sunday Masses at our parish, as well as the Sunday Mass at Our Lady of Grace in Romney.

We thank His Excellency for visiting us and pray that the Lord continues to bless him in the work he is doing for us and all the people across the great state of West Virginia!


