Dear Neighbors,

I hope everyone enjoyed July 4 celebrations this year. After struggling through Covid-19 it was great to be able to celebrate this holiday.

Thank you to Jake Moore for chairing the festivities. It was a herculean effort and was greatly appreciated by all members. Jake has a huge group of volunteers that support his efforts. Without all of you, this event would not be possible. Thank you for coming together to support our community.

Last week your board met to approve several items which include road paving, boom mowing, continued engineering study of our spillway, cleaning of the forebays near Hickory Creek and opening of the Shore Shack. I was thrilled with the 4th of July weekend. The volunteers did an amazing job, providing a family-friendly, community event that entertained all ages! It made me proud to be part of this community.

I am also excited to announce we will be transitioning to a new software package to manage member accounts for both Blue Ridge Property Owners Association and Ridge Utilities, Inc. This new software will bring consistency and efficiency to the office. Even better, it will save the members money and give a single portal for you to view your accounts. We are building the system now and should have it active by the 4th Quarter water billing cycle. Please be on the lookout for an invitation from our office to accept the account from "PayHOA". Don't worry. We will still be right here in the office to process anything you would like to in person. We will accept checks and can still do paper invoices. We encourage you to set up your account! It will give you all the information you need at your fingertips and give you quick access to make your payments. This software will save you time, and the association money.

**We have seen some owners are letting people in the gate that have already called the office to be let in, but denied entry. Most of the people who call are just wanting to come in to look at the lake or see property, however, we don't always know who is trying to gain access to our community. Please remember if you let someone in the gate, you are responsible for their actions.**

### PARKING of VEHICLES

The area between the edge of the roads and the RU black meter box is BRPOA property and normally referred to as right-of-way. We are seeking your cooperation and requesting that no vehicles, trailers, boats, RV's, or any item be parked there except when unloading of delivery items. This is especially important during bad weather and mowing months. Vehicles obstructing the roadways may be removed without notice. Thanks in advance for your assistance. Let's all be safe!

### Trash and recycling

We would like to reinforce the value of using the county recycling centers to reduce the trash Updike takes and hence our tipping fees. We are close to the Trevilians recycling center, as well as other sites if you are heading towards Mineral/Richmond. Many things can be recycled. ### MARINA GAS SALES

Many of you have already used our new self service fuel pump during 2020. We no longer have an attendant at the pump. You may buy your gas by going to the office and obtaining a key fob. This fob will allow you to prepay for a stated amount of gallons of gas at the current pump price. After prepaying for the gas during office hours you can then use the fob at any time to fuel your boat with gas. This new pump has made it more accessible for our members to fuel boats at their leisure instead of on fixed days and hours in the past.

**Ladies and Gentlemen**, just a gentle reminder on reporting items that require attention but are not life-threatening situations once the office is closed. Please call Louisa County Central dispatch, 967-1234 to report the following (examples):

1. Water Leaks
2. Gates not working or a broken gate board
3. Tree down blocking a road
4. Items in the lake or loose boats
5. Problems with a boat located in one of the marinas
6. Lost & Found Animals

This is Standard Operating Procedure. Once dispatcher is contacted, they will notify appropriate BRS Staff Members to respond.

### ***What's with all the buoys?***

If you're fortunate enough to be on the Lake during the week, you may have noticed a number of inflatable buoys on the west end. This is a Slalom course.

A handful of members put this into the water on weekdays for a competitive approach to the sport.

Slalom skiing involves a multi-buoy course that the skier must go around in order to complete the pass. A complete slalom water ski course consists of 26 buoys. There are entrance gates at the beginning and end of the course that the skier must go between, and there are 6 turn buoys that the skier must navigate around in a zig-zag pattern. The remainder of the buoys are for the driver to ensure the boat goes straight down the center of the course.

With each pass through the course, the rope is shortened at specific increments to make it more difficult to reach the buoy width.

While a slalom course is designed to not entangle boats, please be aware as you travel around the lake.

## **BLUE RIDGE SHORES PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION RULES OF OPERATION FOR GOLF CARTS — 2021**

1. Golf carts are limited to a self-propelled vehicle that is designed to transport persons playing golf and their equipment on a golf course.
2. **All golf carts must be registered with the Association and obtain an ANNUAL DECAL. The 2021 decals are available and the annual fee is \$50.00.**
3. Owners must provide evidence of insurance at Virginia minimum and maintained in the golf cart at all times.
4. Owners must possess a valid state driver's license.
5. Owners must comply with all laws pertaining to the use and possession of alcoholic beverages.
6. Only the number of people the golf cart is designed to seat may ride in the golf cart. Passengers shall not be carried on the part of the golf cart designed to carry golf bags or other equipment.
7. Golf carts shall be operated to the extreme right of the roadway and must yield to all vehicles and pedestrian traffic.
8. Golf carts shall be operated only between sunrise and sunset, unless equipped with such lights as are required in Section 46.2-1010 (Virginia Code).
9. Golf carts shall not be operated during inclement weather or when visibility is impaired by weather, smoke, fog or other conditions.
10. Golf carts shall display a slow-moving vehicle emblem in conformity with Section 46.2-1081 (Virginia Code).

***The restrooms at the main beach will be open Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend. They will be open during our office hours, 8-4 M-F and 8-2 Saturday.***
