I was Red Flt Ldr, escorting B-24s to Halberstadt. Yellow Flt had lost me going through some flak and my flt was alone. I saw a gaggle of U/I A/C about twenty miles to the right of the bombers! course and went to investigate with my flt. There were about twenty E/A which seemed to be. forming and climbing up. They were level and slightly higher than I was and rather strung out in a turn to port. We turned in behind their string. I took two short bursts at long range and much deflection while in a climbing turn to the left, in and attempt to break them up. Results were unobserved. I maneuvered behind a FW 190, and, after a couple of small deflection shots I got right behind him. I observed strikes on his right wing and fuselage just behind the cockpit, and the E/A caught fire, and then skidded off to the left. I watched him for a short time and he went down burning and smoking, obviously out of control. I last saw him at about 15,000 ft, going down gently, with a skid to the left. I believe from the reaction of the plane, a jerk up after after I hit it, followed by the gentle out of control dive, and place where I hit wing roots, cockpit, that the pilot was killed. The pilot did not get out while I was watching. The E/As tactics consisted of a tight turn to the left from which he straightened out, allowing me to line up on him. My flt broke this gaggle up and they never got to the bombers.
