January 26, 2020 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Mt 4:12-23

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

A people in darkness have seen a great light! I noticed several TV news segments last week about the temporary depression we can slip into at this time of year called SAD, Seasonal Affective Disorder. A major trigger of its onset is the environment. Especially now, with long dark nights of winter, and cloudy overcast days bringing their gloom and fog, a person's motivation and energy level is easily sapped. Once-uplifting hopes or lofty goals can be pulled downward by the dragging feel of the heavy clouds and everything inconveniently muddy or wet. So today's gospel may be right on time! Matthew introduces Jesus' public ministry with a promising announcement from Isaiah 8:23-9:1, "The people in darkness have seen a great light!" For the people who first heard Matthew in Jesus' time, there was a lot of darkness to trudge through. Seeing a new light out would be so welcome. If you ask, "How bad was it at the time of Jesus' appearance"? Well, it was pretty bad. If it wasn't bleak enough just to live miserably under Roman government domination, the reading today at mass talks about the gossip spreading around Galilee, that the people's latest exciting prophet John had just been thrown into one of Herod's black site-jails. So much for the spiritual resurgence and hopeful mission of greater things to come! But that all wonderfully demonstrates how 'dark' it had become right before Jesus began making public appearances. He will shine all the more. We probably don't pick up this line so much in that most popular of psalms, the 23rd Psalm, but verse 4 says, 'even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death'. So seasons of darkness and deep valleys are not new to the people of God. But now, Jesus is new! He brings New Light! Matthew says it two ways in 4:16 that 1) "the people in darkness have now seen a great light!" and 2) "On those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death, light has arisen."

So, 'You got a light'? We all answer 'Yes' now! It is Christ. He says in John 8:12, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." Reminiscent of the recent Christmas images of splendorous angels in the sky and the guiding star in the sky, God broke into our darkness to shine a path through and out of it. John the Baptist had been saying this much when he described Jesus' saving work as a baptism with fire and the Holy Spirit (Matthew 3:11). This fire of God is the inspiring light and motivation He brings to darkness and frozenness. We certainly see this at Pentecost when the apostles are stuck in fear huddling in the upper room and then the Holy Spirit enlightens then with fire and emboldens them to move out into mission (Acts 2:1-4).

Have you ever heard of Plato's Cave? I remember long ago reading Plato's Republic wherein he wants to draw a picture of the process involved in discovering/learning truth. It is a picture of a Cave with people sitting looking at a cave wall with a fire behind them. Because the fire light is behind their backs, they only see the projected shadows of things, as images cast upon the wall. Plato makes the point that to see things as they truly are, we have to turn around toward the light and use it to view reality in its fullness. Seeking truth involves us in seeing past or seeing through the shadow of things. Think of Jesus as the fire-light that enables us to see clearly and not be misled or fooled by shadowy illusions. Our daily experience of life often amounts only to dealing in these shadowy pieces of reality because of rushing events around us and the time limits put upon us. Yet, John said it before Jesus, and Jesus himself fully proclaims it today, that the way out of the cave of illusions, is to "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matthew 4:17). Repent, or 'turn back', or 'turn around', or 'return to God'. This is the process of 'metanoia': converting our minds/hearts to viewing life fully in the light of God, not partially in shadows temporarily flashed upon a screen. So many scripture passages speak of Christians as 'children of light' who are not content with stumbling or fumbling in the dark. Embracing Christ means living by God's eternal truth and walking in His lasting light. Ephesians 5:8-9 says, "Once, you were in darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light, because light produces every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth." 1 John 1:5says, "God is light, and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say, "We have fellowship with him," while we continue to walk in darkness, we lie and do not act in truth." And 1 Thessalonians 5:4-5 "But you are not in darkness.....for all of you are children of the light ar dren of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness." As dark as it may a light has been given to us. As dreary as it seems around us, a cle opened to us. Knowledge of Christ and walking with him brings u... darkness!
